Study for undergraduate students on the encyclical by Pope John Paul II. Thursdays at 4 PM in the library.

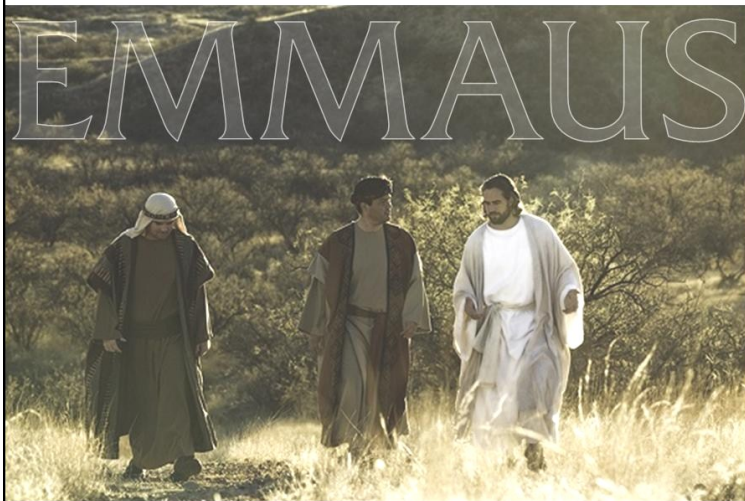
Introduction to Christianity

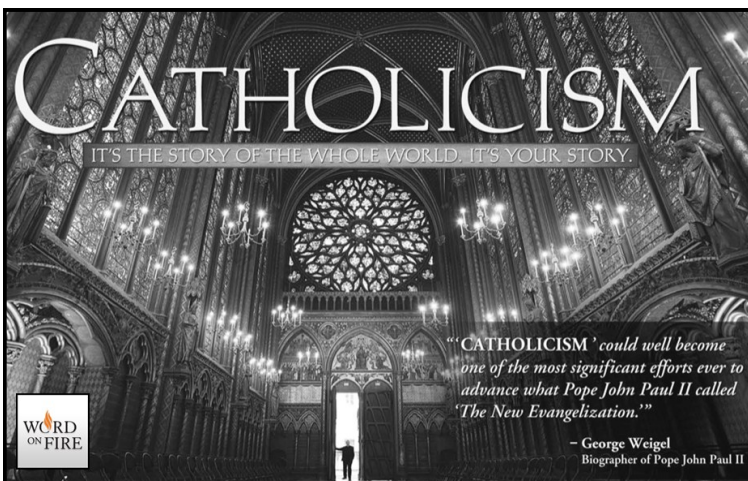

- Fall permits are \$100.
- Save money & purchase a yearly parking permit for \$270 (valid Aug 2012-Aug 2013)

Those receiving permits will be notified by May 25. There will be no special status granted to people who've had a permit in the past.

A Newman parking permit grants the right to park in a Newman lot from **7:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday-Friday ONLY**. No overnight parking.
