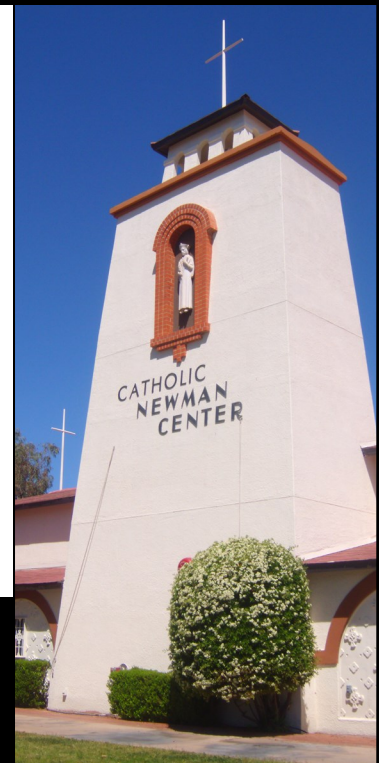

# BYZANTINE CATHOLIC RITE DIVINE LITURGIES TO BE OFFERED AT NEWMAN CENTER

The Byzantine Catholic Church is one of several Churches which make up what are known as “Eastern Rite Catholics.” These are Catholic Churches (in communion with the Bishop of Rome) that exist in the geographic locations dominated by the Orthodox Church after the Great Schism in 1054 A.D. These Churches have maintained a certain measure of autonomy and many of the traditions of the Eastern Church, especially with regards to liturgy and worship. As members of these Churches have moved around

the world, they have taken their traditions with them and established parishes and diocese which exist alongside the Roman Catholic Church throughout the world. Here in Tucson, there are 2 Eastern Rite Catholic Communities: St. Melany’s Byzantine Catholic Church and St. Michael’s Ukrainian Catholic Church. I was approached last spring by Fr. Bob Rankin, the Pastor at St. Melany’s to discuss how we at Newman might assist in reaching out to Eastern Catholics at the University. He suggested that we offer an Eastern Rite Divine Liturgy (Mass) on some basis of regularity at the Newman Center. Our staff cannot celebrate such a liturgy, so this would mean the 2 Eastern priests in town would take on that responsibility. That is still in the works. But for a start, we are going to offer 2 Byzantine Divine Liturgies at times for our regularly scheduled evening Masses on Sunday, October 20. A choir and cantors from St. Melany’s will be present with Fr. Rankin to lead the worship and we will all be instructed in the differences between the Roman Rite and the Byzantine Rite as we participate. I have welcomed this as both a spiritual and cultural experience. In weeks to come, we will be offering the Diviner Liturgy in our classroom simultaneous with one of our evening Masses. I want you to be aware. The liturgy will seem strange to us, but my prayer is that we will enriched by the experience.

### READINGS IN ISAIAH

**Wednesday Morning Scripture Series  
with Fr. Bart Hutcherson, OP

Fr. Bart will begin by examining the Prophetic Tradition of Ancient Israel. Who was (or were) the prophet(s) Isaiah? What are the major themes of Isaian Prophecy? Then we will examine texts from the Prophet Isaiah associated with the Advent and Christmas Cycle of Readings in the Church’s Liturgy. A second Series in the Spring Semester will examine the Isaiah Readings of the Lenten and Paschal Seasons. Each session will last 1 hour and be held in the Newman Classroom.

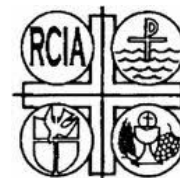
