

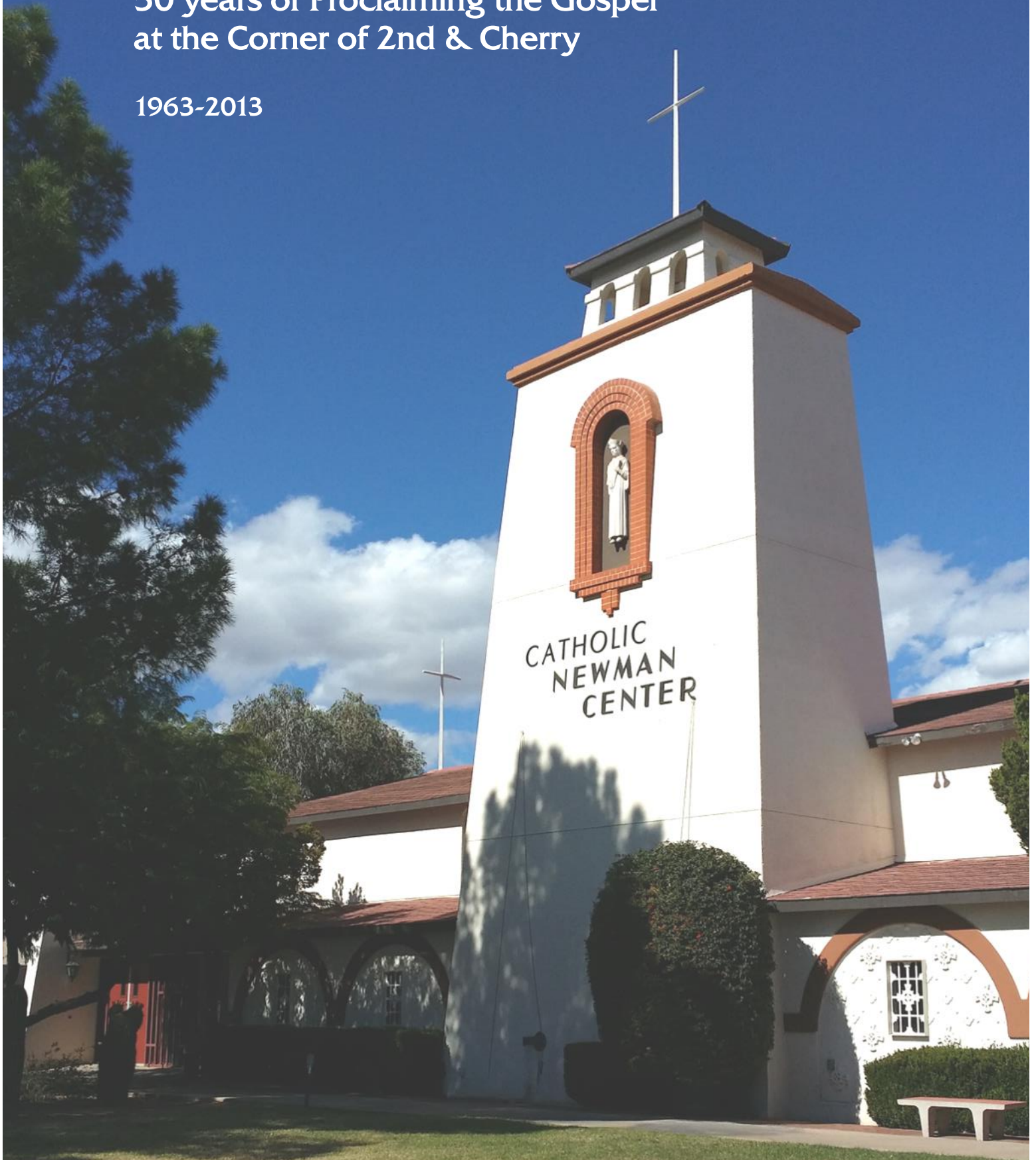

NEWMAN CENTER SPRING 2014 PARKING PERMITS

You must be a registered Newman parishioner to receive a parking permit

Applications for spring 2014 parking permits are now being accepted through Friday, December 13. Spring parking permits are \$100. Those receiving permits will be notified by December 20. There will be no special status granted to people who've had a permit in the past. A Newman parking permit grants the right to park in a Newman lot from **7:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday-Friday ONLY**. No overnight parking. **A permit does not guarantee the availability of a space.**

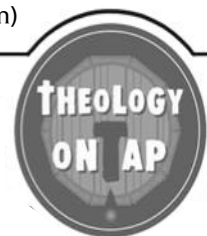
