Alleluia.*

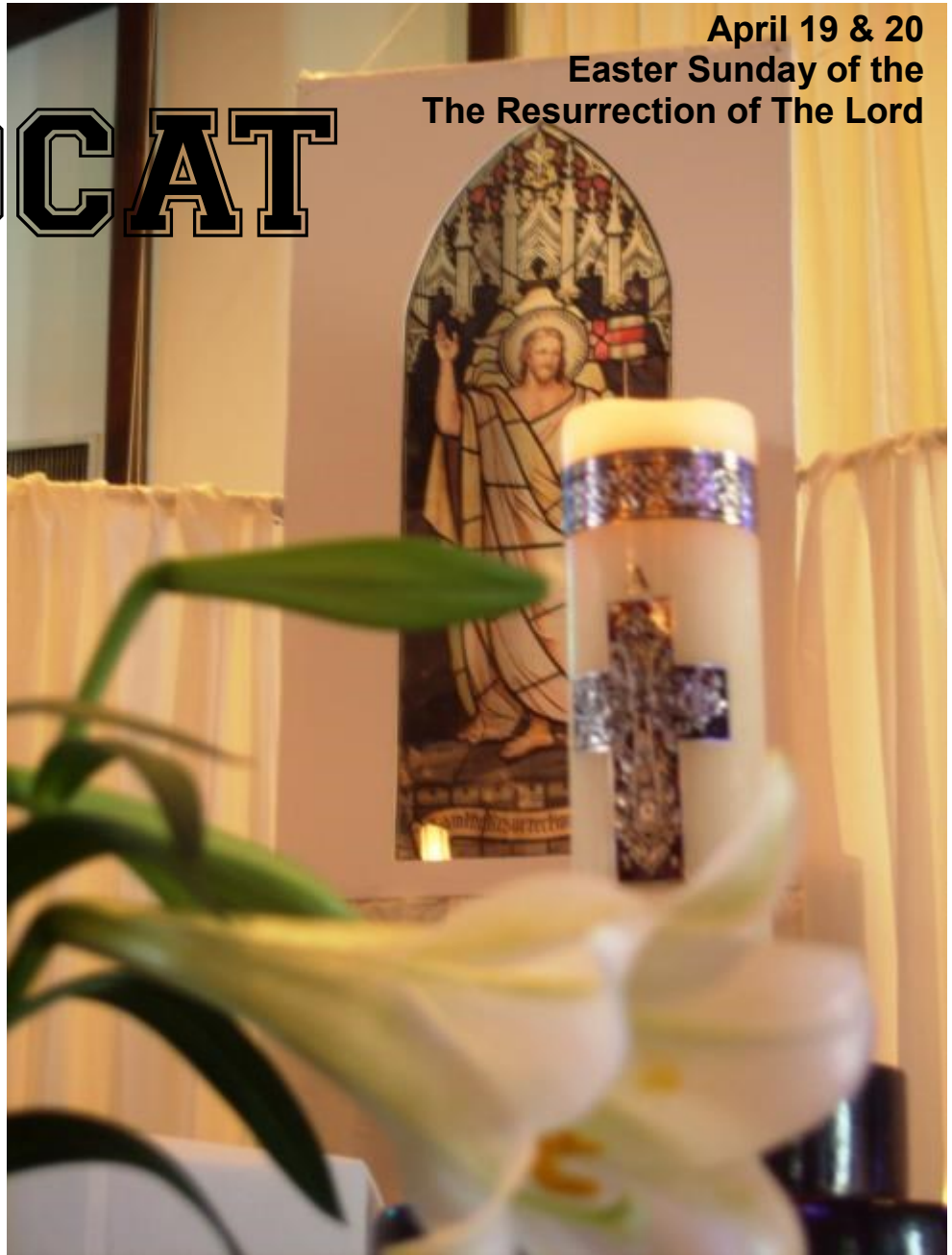
As I celebrate this Easter, I am aware that I am in an odd place. People of the Parish and friends in Tucson have forced me, at last, into that "this is the last time I will..." place. Everything these days seems to be focused on the reality that I am moving on. But even so, this Holy Week, my last Holy Week as Pastor of the Newman Center, has provided me with much opportunity for reflection and memory. I love Holy Week so much and this community has allowed me to celebrate it richly 10 times. You have walked with me on this journey of the Paschal mystery 10 times. 10 Palm Sundays, 10 Holy Thursdays. 10 Good Fridays, 10 Holy Saturdays, 10 Easter Sundays. You have shouted Amen as I have plunged dozens of adult converts into the waters of baptism at 10 Easter Vigils and Responded with Resplendent Alleluias at the Eater dismissal. But the Pascal mystery has not been present only in Holy Week and Easter, because we are a resurrection people all year long. We have together walked the death and resurrection of Jesus continuously for 10 years. And, as I celebrate my last Easter as your Pastor, I thank you for journeying with me to so many resurrections.

Easter is late this year, so the end of the school year will come quickly and there are many celebrations to attend, many thank-yous to dispense, final preparations to be made for the transition that is coming in 6 or 7 short weeks. But first let us enter fully into this Easter, thanking Jesus again for the gift of his Passion and Resurrection, thanking him that he has called us into this Paschal community and invited us to share in New Life.

Wherever you celebrate this most holy of days, I hope you are surrounded by love and that New Life offered in Christ Jesus is your in abundance. Happy Easter!

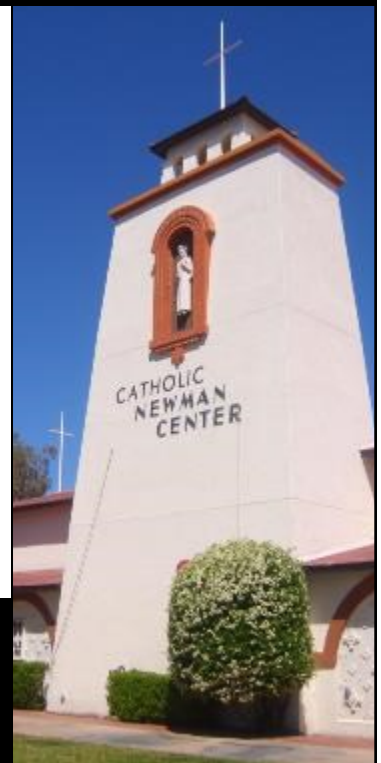

## PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE-BACK

University of Arizona Police Dept., 1852 E. 1st St.

On Saturday April 26 from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM, The University of Arizona Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public an opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their residence of potentially dangerous expired, unused and unwanted prescription drugs.

Bring your prescription medications, pills or tablets in original plastic containers, for disposal to The University of Arizona Police Department located at 1852 E. 1st Street. This service is provided free of charge and is completely anonymous.

Collection Day Protocols:

- All solid dosage pharmaceutical products in consumer containers may be accepted, NO GLASS CONTAINERS.
- No liquid products will be accepted.
- No aerosols or inhalers will be accepted.
- Intra-venous solutions, injectibles, and syringes will not be accepted.
- Remove all personal information from the prescription label.
