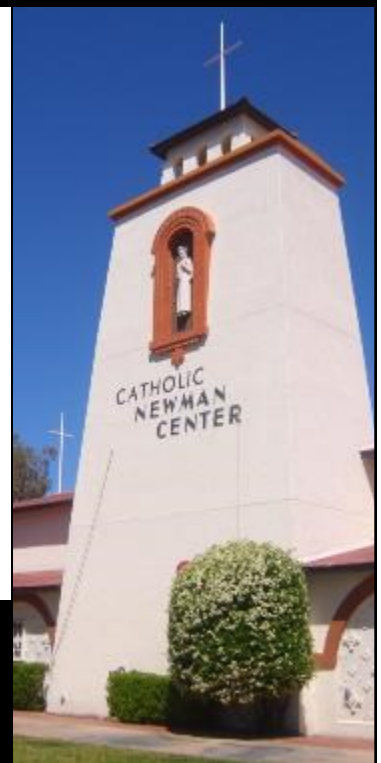

Dear Friends,

All week my heart has been full and my head spinning with memories from last Sunday's celebration. The liturgy was one of the more meaningful that I ever had the pleasure of celebrating and the party at O'Malley's was over-the-top. The expressions of love and the sharing of memories made the whole day a wonderful time of celebration. I am so sorry that I did not make it around to greet every person who came to the party, there were simply too many and not enough time. But I am grateful, nonetheless, for your presence.



For those who were not able to make it, you missed a great day of celebrating who we are as a Newman community. The Mass, in many ways a simple 3rd Sunday of Easter Mass, was made very special by the addition of a couple of elements: In my preaching, centered on the Gospel reading about Jesus journey to Emmaus with Cleopas and another disciple to Emmaus, I assured those in attendance that Jesus wants to walk all of life's journey with us and, in fact, does. Our sadness, confusion, anger, despondence keep us from recognizing Jesus on the way. But it is Jesus himself, sometimes in the guise of other Christians who help us into his Word and to find a place at the table where he can reveal himself to us in the breaking of the bread. I thanked the community for being Jesus on the journey for me and allowing me to be Jesus on the journey for you. I ended with encouragement that we all see our role to help other find Jesus in Word and Sacrament.

After the renewal of baptismal vows, and prayers of the faithful, many members of the community joined in a special offertory profession, each presenting a red rose representing the 10 years I have served as your pastor. There were representatives of the student and permanent community, student leaders, couples whose marriage vows I witnessed, children I baptized, adults I received into the Church. It was one of the best simple gestures of community I have ever experienced.

The presence of Alumni David Mares, Clare Horton, Ross Helland, Kyle Wilson and Herman Johannesmeyer - forming a reconstituted one-show-only Emmaus Band reunion was icing on an already beautiful cake! It was so wonderful to hear them together again.

The party was wall-to-wall chaos. O'Malley's was packed. Food and drink were in plenty supply and everybody was enjoying the company. The entertainment included many beautiful surprises in a program that was at times roast, at times tribute, and at times talent show. I enjoyed myself very much. When given a turn to speak, I revealed that I decided to create a permanent physical connection to this ministry by having the Newman Cross tattooed on my right calf. I revealed the body art at the party. It will serve as an endearing memory of 10 amazing years in my life (and will likely be a great discussion starter wherever I go).

I really appreciate the hard work of the committee who put the celebration together and all those who participated in the day. SUMMER & FALL PARKING PERMITS

You must be a registered Newman parishioner to receive a parking permit

Applications for summer & fall 2014 parking permits are being accepted through Friday, May 16.

- Summer permits are \$35 for each session (pre-session, Session 1, and Session 2) or \$100 for the entire summer.
- Fall permits are \$100.
- Save money & purchase a yearly parking permit for \$270 (valid Aug 2014-Aug 2015)

Those receiving permits will be notified by May 30. There will be no special status granted to people who've had a permit in the past.

A Newman parking permit grants the right to park in a Newman lot from **7:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday-Friday ONLY**. No overnight parking.
