LITURGY CORNER 11

LITERAL & SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE WORD: ADVENT

As a liturgical season, Advent anticipates the celebration of Christmas. So in anticipation of Advent, let's begin looking at what that means.

Literally. The Latin word *adventus*, meaning arrival or coming, translates the Greek word used in the New Testament, *parousia*, having the same meaning. In NT contexts it refers to what we generally call The Second Coming of Christ at the end of the age. The theme for the readings of the first two weeks of Advent, following on the Feast of Christ the King, concerns this Advent yet to come. The Sunday readings then transition into the theme of Israel's awaiting Christ's first arrival, to be celebrated on Christmas.

Spiritually. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* provides a pithy summary of the spiritual meaning of this liturgical season:

When the Church celebrates *the liturgy of Advent* each year, she makes present [the] ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming. By celebrating the precursor's birth and martyrdom, the Church unites herself to his desire: "He must increase, but I must decrease." (CCC #524)

As our holiday of Thanksgiving Day and holy day of Christ the King approach, we can turn our minds toward our own desire for the Lord's advent in our lives.

We are inviting you to participate in this year's Jesse Giving Tree which will benefit Primavera and Stand Up For Kids. We will use the Jesse Tree and symbols as a way to remind ourselves that the Advent season is a time to prepare for the Christmas season. The symbols are labeled with a 'wish gift' for a boy, girl, mother, father, or teenager. The genealogy of Christ is frequently shown in the form of a tree which springs from Jesse, the father of David, and bears as its fruit the various ancestors of Christ. This "family tree" of Christ, has ornament symbols of an ancestor or of a prophecy which foretells Jesus' coming.
