Jacek and I will be seeking volunteers to help coordinate adult faith formation in the wake of Sr. Elizabeth's departure.

Summer Squeeze. As you know from previous financial reports, the Center has a perpetual cash-flow problem, which was pointedly noted in our recent audit. In the summer months this is particularly severe. Please don't forget us during the summer months!
