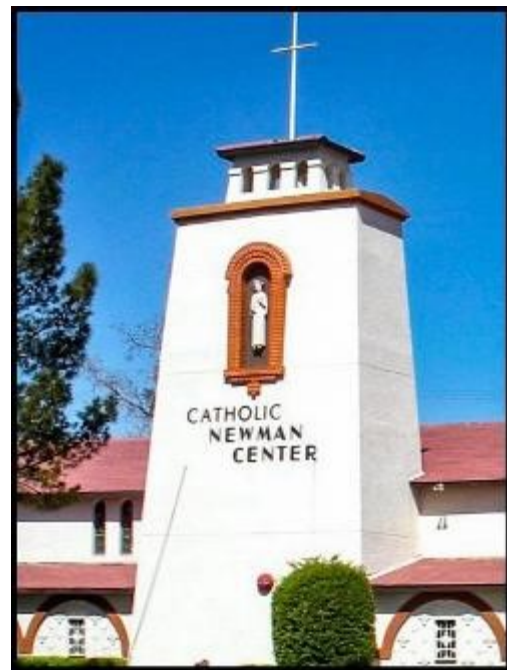

## *Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew*

**T**wo powerful stories in our Sunday Readings today remind us that God is deeply interested in investing in our lives, if we are willing to walk with Him.

In the “Ten Commandments” God lays out clearly what it means to be in relationship with Him, and with one another. In the first three “Commandments” we are to know, love, and serve God above all persons and things. To keep His name, day, and our relationship to Him precious and respected.

In the remaining seven “Commandments” we are “to love our neighbor as we love ourselves” by being good stewards of one another’s person, lives, relations, and goods. For to Love God above all things... is also to allow ourselves to be ‘soaked’ in His ‘Love and Friendship’. God’s “Commandments” are not about being enslaved, but rather about celebrating the call to walk with Him daily, and to share the fruits of this encounter with others.

This is what it means to ‘walk in the light of God’ and to be grounded in truth and beauty. Jesus, being grounded deeply in the Father and Spirit, could not help but to react when he walked into the temple in Jerusalem. His ‘reaction’ which to our hearing - may appear to be intense - is more of a reflection of the Living God who does not suffer humanity choosing the lesser road lightly. ‘Don’t make Godly places NOT what they are NOT supposed to be’... whether they are the sacred space of a temple or church.... or the sacred space of another person, community, or yourself. “Love the Lord your God with your whole heart, soul, and mind.. And, love your neighbor as you love yourself”.

As we continue upon our Lenten journey may we keep walking forward with and in God.... and, along and besides one another. “O Lord I do believe, Help my unbelief”
