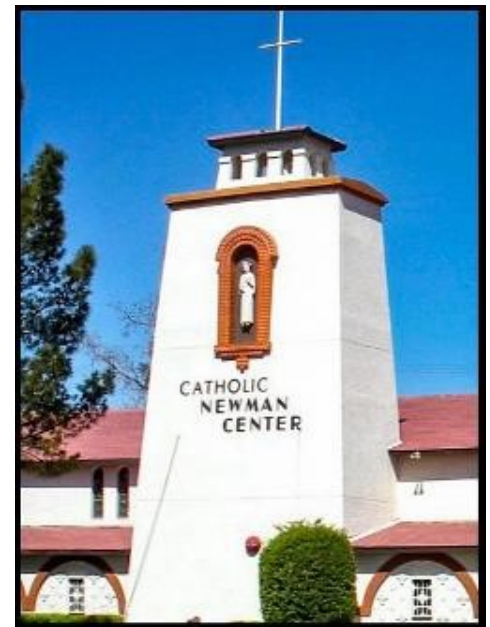

Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

It's hard to believe that 25 years have passed since my classmates and I had the hands of Bishop Cummings laid upon our heads, and the power of the Holy Spirit filled us with zeal and pause... for the ministry of priesthood in the Dominican Order of the Roman Catholic Church.

It seems like yesterday when we processed into St. Mary College Chapel, escorted by our parents, and accompanied by our whole Western Dominican Province, and our families and friends, at 10am on June 11, 1993. What an amazing day of feeling truly and deeply connected to Christ, the true "Vine" that connects and strengthens all of our lives.

So, what has 25 years of priestly ministry taught me? If I had to sum it up into a couple sentences... I would have to say that God is goodness, truth, and love... and to pursue these to things is exhausting... But, if we do so, faithfully, and through all the ups and downs of life... there is a peace and joy..... that cannot be broken or undone.

It is this same Spirit that helped St Paul find his way back to "the true Vine" that he had always been seeking.. when he was lost in fog after being - called by Christ - from a path of destruction to a path of life.

God's Spirit always prunes way all that is false and not helpful..... and 'frees up' a river of 'true life' that allows us to find our authentic home in God. My classmates and I are deeply grateful for your presence. We have grown much over these 25 years, and strive to keep "remaining in God" as we mature in our ministries.

God is present every time we gather -in his name - around the table of Word of God; God is present whenever we participate in the breaking of the bread , and the pouring out the chalice of Christ's blood; and, God is strongly present in the gathering of our community in prayer, worship, communion, and sending forth!

In all that we do... may we continue to "remain in Christ" whether it be in celebrating 25 years of priestly service, or in our weekly commission to "Go In Peace to live in Love".
