Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

No prophet is without honor except in his native place among his own people”
This is quite a statement made by Jesus! It expresses both frustration and the occasional truth of living in community. Can we be prophetic when we live in community, and others are familiar with our history?

It has been said that “familiarity breeds contempt.” Why is this? In the case of Jesus in this Gospel story, maybe it’s because as we hear often in Gospel of Mark, that the community/observers were “both amazed and afraid.” That they “found him too much.” And, I m guessing didn’t know what to do with all of this

Change can be both exciting and scary! We can see both the potential for wonderful growth, but also the possibility for failure. But, even though there are always two sides to a coin... we must take the risk of living our lives to the fullness that God intends for us.

Jesus came in the Spirit, to give sight, to break barriers, to free captives, and to proclaim God’s favor everywhere....

This is what light does... it shines, illuminates, and leads! Although frustrated by his own community’s lack of faith, Jesus regroups and moves to other places to proclaim good news. He’s not turning his back on his community, he’s just moving on...

May we have the courage to move on to where Christ is calling us to shed his light... wherever that is, especially when we’re feeling trapped. May God’s spirit of good counsel always help to guide us in responding to fear’s barriers... both in our lives and the lives of others. Amen!
