Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Our Gospel for today says that Jesus returned in the “power of the Spirit” and going home entered a synagogue and read what was handed to him:

“The Spirit of the Lord is Upon Me, because he has anointed me”.

This is our theme for this academic year, given to ground us in our “mission” here at Newman: “to be transformed through an encounter with the Spirit of Truth and the Love of God”.

In our first reading from the Book of Nehemiah we hear “for today is holy to the Lord your God. Do not be sad and do not weep.” Instead eat, drink, and share your resources with those who are in need! At these words - we are told that the people were weeping. They have come from bondage and captivity, and have not heard God’s word proclaimed so freely in a long time.... so their tears flow, as they begin to feel the hope which accompanies ‘God’s anointing Spirit’ touching them again.

This same anointing touch is the “truth” that the people of the small synagogue in Nazareth experience when Jesus proclaims that God’s Spirit is Upon him! Something new is coming... and it is going to be transformative! The chains of death are going to be broken, and life is going to spring forth... in a way that has never been seen before. Liberty is going to come to those in captivity, those imprisoned by a variety of circumstances will be set free, the blind will see, those impaired will have mobility, and God’s favor will be proclaimed and experienced as the sunlight fills the sky.

May we allow ourselves to encounter this Spirit of the Lord! May its “anointing” transform us and allow us to be freed by God’s powerful “spirit of truth and love”. As we are freed may we lower the walls of hatred and fear, thus constructing pathways to peace for all to experience and share. Amen!
