Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is in the Lord”.

It is always a great reminder to be called back to reliance on God, and his Spirit that is Upon us, and Anoints us! Lack of this dependence makes us like “barren bushes” in desert places “that enjoy no change of season, but stand in a lava waste of salt and empty earth.” What an image Jeremiah gives us.... to be that dehydrated from the Spirit of Truth and the Love of God!

Last Monday Fr. Emmanuel and I took our eight Novices to Sabino Canyon and hiked over seven miles through the beauty of saguaros, pala verdes, and other amazing vegetation. We crossed rushing flows of water which interrupted our pleasant hike up the main trail, and forced us to ‘wade in the water’ if we wished to continue into the deeper beauty of Sabino Canyon. Some took off their shoes every time we crossed, and others of us just rolled up pants legs and just walked, and ran... right in and through. The water was chilly, but refreshing, after awhile! I found that it drew me deeper into the beauty and spirit of Sabino Canyon, as it made me take some breaths every time we crossed a wide stream.

Hoping in God Jeremiah says, “is like a tree planted besides the waters, that stretches out its roots to the stream”. We have to stretch our thirsty souls and lives.... towards the sound of God’s life giving water... flowing through the canyons of our being. We have to be not resistant to allowing our roots/feet to get in to those life-giving steams... that as Jeremiah says, “help us to not fear the heat when it comes, and keep our leaves green; in the year of drought we show no distress, but still bear fruit.”

May we realize that in Jesus, God’s real love among us.... that ‘Blessing’ always flows, and Spirit is always Upon us! May God’s anointing touch help us not to be dehydrated from the call of Charity in all seasons. May we not succumb to separating ourselves from the truth and love of God, thus falling into “woes”.... But, to rise... and wade.... in God’s abundant friendship... which is always streaming and present.
