An allegorical painting by the English artist group Pre-Raphaelite Brothers (PRB) in the mid 1800s. They signed all their works not individually but as a group PRB. We know this painting was done by William Holman Hunt (1827–1910). The door in the painting has no handle, and can therefore be opened only from the inside, representing "the obstinately shut mind" [and heart].

According to Hunt: "I

Painted the picture with what I thought, unworthy though I was, to be by Divine command, and not simply as a good Subject." He took inspiration from Revelation 3:20: "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if any man hear My voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with Me".
