Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

ord send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth"

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, and officially close the season of Easter. The next two Sundays will remind us of the gift of God's inner life as a Trinity of creation, reconciliation, and sustaining love; AND, the Power of Christ's Mystical Body and Blood, as Church and Sacrament.

The last weeks and months have been quite a journey! We have been deeply challenged and disquieted as a people and global community. In our news we've heard that we're at over 100,000 deaths in the US due to the Covid19 crisis and in the midst of this shifting sand... we're trying to figure out what "reopening" means in a time that is uncertain, BUT.. seeking clarity, vaccination, and a guiding peace into the future.

These circumstances are similar to the early church that we meet in today's readings. They are a people in the middle of a serious, and violent religious Persecution, that was wiping people out in waves..... Fear, and uncertainty was driving folks to "shelter in place" because their lives were in danger, and there was no 'immediate' remedy as to when this would stop.

The followers of Jesus, and his mother Mary are all "sheltering" when the promise of the Holy Spirit comes upon them, and they receive a Spirit of "truth and love" which helps them to activate their "gifts" and to navigate 'effectively' their present situation, and to 'move' into the future with faith, hope, and love!

At the Newman Center, we have decided not to reopen until the welcome mass in late August. It was a decision made with deep prayer, discussion, and a lot of listening to the Holy Spirit. Many things need to happen between now and the end of August. We are exploring options for cleaning and sanitation; for organizing our church, and other spaces (at Newman) for future Fall semester meetings, as well as figuring out how (this summer) to do 'one' (baptism, reception into the Dominican Laity, and a wedding, with safe and responsible stewardship.

Thank you for your patience and, on going support in all of this... We miss you dearly, and want you to know that we hold you in our thoughts and prayers!

The same Holy Spirit that rushed upon the early followers of Jesus.... continues to "be with us, and to guide us into sanctifying grace.

May we continue to rise with Christ beyond the Easter Season, and into unknown pastures and situations. May the Holy Spirit stir our Newman Community, and help us remain open to the comfort and transformation that God desires to share with us always. Amen!
