Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

t is hard to believe that we are already in mid-August! It has been a very unusual summer, not to mention last few months. It's hard to say what's normal, and even unclear to name if "normal" even exists.

Jesus, like many other teachers of his time, loved the use of parables. He used them as often as he could, and those who heard them were left spellbound.

Parables offer three movements: orientation to something that we think we know... only to disorientate us, then to re-orientate us again - in what is true.

In the Parable of Wheat and the Weeds - 7/19/20 - from the 16th Sunday.. we are invited to have a different response towards the wheat and weeds growing together. Instead of separating them we are called to allow them grow together and for God to do the separating later, if needed. God's grace and mercy will act during the growth of wheat and weeds.

In the Buried Treasure and a Pearl of Great Price - 7/26/20 from the 17th Sunday - we are pointed towards the consideration of the Kingdom of God, being a treasure, or a pearl of great price, which we are to value 'so much' that we would be willing to do 'anything' to attain it. If we do this, the Kingdom can act upon our lives, and make a significant difference.

In the Feeding of the Great Crowd 8/2/20 - from the 18th Sunday - we see Jesus caring for the physical needs of a massive crowd by feeding them spiritually, and then serving them a meal that allows not only everyone to be fed, but also have an abundance leftover. It seems that real generosity produces deep miracles.

In Jesus walking on the water, and Peter joining him for a moment - 8/9/20 - from the 19th Sunday - We are invited to see how deep is our faith. Is our faith only solid when we are in control? What about in those moments where we have no control? Can we hold on to God's promise in Christ, to help us to navigate moments of uncertainty, and to walk on the waters of life with Jesus?

In our last example - Jesus, Canaanite woman, and her daughter - 8/16/20 - from the 20th Sunday - Jesus shows us that persistence pays off even in situations that appear impossible - Even in historical and racial tensions that appear to only close down dialogue. In our final Gospel - the Canaanite woman persists in the truth that Christ's message is intended for all.... And, this produces not only 'healing' for the woman's daughter, but 'confidence and healing' for the woman herself.

As The Pastoral Staff steps away for a little renewal before the "opening" of another academic year of ministry at Newman, in a time of uncertainty, pandemic, social distancing, virtual ministry-classes, and the great need for much flexibility and faith.... We do so confident that whatever is before us as a Newman community, that we will be supported by the Grace of God that transforms and leads.... with the Spirit of truth and the Love of God! Amen!
