# Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

t is amazing how our moods can affect our generosity! If the morning's been good, the whole day seems to have the potential to flow without event or headache. Moods can often affect our decisions if we're not careful, and don't remain focused on a larger picture.

In our first reading we are called to "Seek the Lord, while he may be found, and to Call on Him, while he is still near". This is a call to remain focused on God's higher plan for humanity. We are to seek it, with all that we are, and to allow ourselves to be seized and taken by it.

In today's Gospel we have a "strange" business agreement for the day. Three sets of workers agree upon the same "daily wage" for working in the owner's vineyard.

A problem arises when it comes to receiving payment for hours worked. Some have worked the whole day... others.. half the day, and the last group.. only for an hour. The owner pays all three groups, on the "agreed" upon wage! They all get the exact same pay! Those who have worked "All Day" in the heat of the day" take issue with the owner. The owner hears them out, but pays all the same, regardless of who worked longer.

In real life, this makes no sense! Fair is fair, and people should be compensated for their labors! But, in this parable, Jesus is trying to teach us something important. Life is not always fair..... and, people don't always have access to basic human rights. God always has an eye for the poor, whether this poverty is material, emotional, physical, or spiritual. God is interested in us and our needs, and will "hire" us no matter the point of the day. For with God, there is always room for mercy.

May we have the courage to see beyond our own need for security, health, and comfort.... into the situations of others who hunger and thirst for access and love. "Fear is useless what is needed is trust"
