## Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

August is upon us and the time has come to launch a new semester! Students are returning to campus, and the plan is to resume operations at the UofA with protocols appropriate to wherever we are in this present culture of the pandemic.

We are grateful to welcome five new people to our Dominican and to Pastoral Staff community. They are Sr. Lynn Allvin, OP - Full time, Nathan Payne - New Music Director (Tom Booth will remain as a valuable support to our music program and Newman community, but in a reduced capacity). Sr. Eileen Hinsburger, OP - retired/volunteer, Sr. Fatima Morales, OP - Novice/volunteer, and Br. Diego Maria Carrazco, OP - Residency Student/volunteer. So, as you can see.. our Dominican Community and staff will be larger next year.

One change for the Fall semester will be the 7pm mass on Sunday. We will NOT have it. With the pandemic we had to reduce everything, and will be gradually building things up again, especially our liturgical ministries. We are not able to sustain a consistent group of musicians and other ministers for the 7pm mass all year. The plan will be to continue working on building our liturgical music bench at all the Masses, and to see if we can sustain all the musicians and Masses. We'll also see if we need four masses on Sunday. If we do, the 7pm will return in the new semester, if not, we'll continue to focus on a qualitative experience for the Masses that we have. Thank you for your patience and openness to journey with us in this new adventure.

Our Student Ministry, Young Adult, and Resident Community ministries will continue with some creative adaptations to adjust to the pandemic, as well, as to grow and develop according to present and changing needs. Lastly, we will continue to keep our liturgical ministers schedule in place, and will move communion back to the end of Mass. I see this as a hybrid version of our protocols before having to (if needed) move back into lesser numbers able to participate in liturgical ministries, socially distancing our pews, and a deep cleaning on the church.

I'm glad that we've taken our time with regards to opening the Newman Center building, and ask that our present status on the building remain the same for now. Thanks be to God for our new doorbells!

Let's continue to be "open" in our hospitality after the Masses at the doors, and wherever we can... responsibly, as a good stewards. I also ask you to please seriously consider becoming a minister of hospitality/usher. We need you, and it's a great way to be involved.

Our new theme for the 2021-22 school year rises out of the Gospel of Luke 17:6: "Increase our Faith"

May we continue to set aside our useless fears for healthy ones predicated on faith. It's time to welcome those new to the University, Newman, and Tucson into our community and mission. May we all be "transformed through an encounter with the Spirit of Truth and the Love of God (the living Christ)" Our Lady who can untie knots.... Pray for us! Amen.





I felt like I had come Home!

### Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew Bonus

o whom shall we go? You have the words of everlasting life"

Jesus puts his true identity and mission on the line. "I am the bread and wine of life.... Unless you physically and spiritually eat... drink... and, take me into yourself... you will have no life! How much more clear, and confusing... can this statement from Jesus be? He is saying eat and consume who he is! To the minds and sensibilities of his audience ..this is gross and unacceptable! They could only hear and perceive the physical application of what he was saying.... The shock of his statement, and their lack of a deeper relationship with Jesus..... causes them to only be overwhelmed by his statement, and not drawn deeper into the truth of his words.

The Gospel tells us that many left his company afterwards and returned to their lives. Jesus turns to his closest followers and asks... "Are you going to leave me too? They reply, "Where are we going to go? You have the words of everlasting life! I love this statement of faith that Jesus's disciples make.... "Where shall we go! Your words are life..., everlasting life! They have seen and experienced things that are healing and changing their lives for the better. They are finding a freedom and wholeness that they have never known.... And, they are not going to leave his side.

This is the power of a faith nurtured, tested, deepened, and discovered! This is a faith that is equipped to withstand Jesus's revelation that He and the Father are One.... and, does care enough about humanity - to be deeply involved with us!

It is this understanding that allows committed followers of Jesus, to keep listening through the difficult language and struggles of life.... to hear the truth of Gospel.

May we have the courage to allow ourselves to betaken by Jesus - into his Love and Spirit.... Thus, being healed from all that impedes our healthy development as laborers of peace, justice, and charity in the world. Amen!
