Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

oday's first reading recounts Elijah's experience of being a burnout prophet who is - exhausted and tired from the journey - of being in God's service. God has continued to work with him, and to accompany him through the twists and turns of his vocation. Always reminding him, that he is not alone. Today we find Elijah tired and forgetful of God's loving support, and "praying for death" under a tree, and out in the desert alone. Despite the wall that Elijah's constructed, God sends an angel to rouse him from the sleep of self pity, and to eat, drink, and pay attention to his personal needs for renewal. At first, Elijah resists.... but at the persistence of God's love... echoing..., again, and again.... He finally surrenders, and eats and drinks.... After a while his strength returns, and he is able to stand up, and walk a great journey to God's mountain, which he climbs, and waits to God to speak to him...

How often do we find ourselves tired, exhausted, and all knotted up by life?!

When this happens... we stop "eating and drinking" what we need... to be whole, happy, and peaceful people... and, fall into negativity, fear, and ungrounded doubts! The good news is that God continues to reach out, and to tap us on the shoulder... "eat and drink.. let go.. try again, forgive, say hello, and so on.....

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus say, "Blest are they who hear the word of God, and practice it". May we have the courage to dig deeper into the voice of God confronting our lives daily, and inviting us to freedom and peace.

Today is the feast day of St. Dominic de Guzman! Founder of the Order of Preachers, and a great source of inspiration and example for the whole Dominican family. It was said of St. Dominic that he spoke either to God or about God always. This implies for me, a person who was always deeply connected to the word, ministry, and love of God in his life, and in the lives of others. May we be encouraged by the prayers of our Holy Father Dominic... to praise.. to bless... and to preach.... that Jesus Christ is Lord... and always accompanies us whenever life takes us. Amen!

NOTE FROM THE BISHOP

Dear Friends,

I received the letter below, slightly edited for the writer's privacy, from a concerned father who is also a medical doctor (pediatrician). His message to me is about our current Covid 19 situation and his family. I pass it along for your consideration:

Dear Bishop

I am (an active Catholic and) father of 2 children and a general pediatrician. I was a Catholic school teacher for 6 years before entering medicine.

I was at Mass this morning ... and noted something quite particular. Of the 6 families with children that I could see, 5 of those families were wearing masks (parents as well as the non-infant children). That was in stark contrast to the rest of the worshipers where only about 25% were wearing masks. ... My wife and I are vaccinated but my children, like the children in the 5 other families that I could see, cannot be vaccinated. I did not feel comfortable for my children in this setting.

There is some emerging data (currently moving from anecdotal to stronger evidence) that the delta variant is affecting children and infants much more than the original COVID-19 strain. I've heard this locally from my colleagues who care for hospitalized children and read published observations from pediatricians outside of Tucson.

Because of this, I ask you to consider taking the following actions:

- 1. Ask Mass attendees directly to wear masks while giving the reason that we need to make Mass attendance safe for those who cannot be vaccinated at this time (children).
- 2. Ask priests and deacons celebrating Mass as well as those participating in the Mass to wear masks when not speaking. This would serve as an example for parishioners in attendance.
- 3. Continue to encourage vaccination for those eligible as you are doing.

Thank you for your time and consideration of my suggestions.

What I recommend is what this young doctor and father urges you to do:

- 1.Directly ask Mass attendees to wear masks while giving the reason that we need to make Mass attendance safe for those who cannot be vaccinated at this time (children).
- 2. Ask priests and deacons celebrating Mass as well as those participating in the Mass to wear masks when not speaking to serve as an example for parishioners in attendance.
- 3. Continue to encourage vaccination for those eligible as you are doing.
- 4. Due to the growing risk for unvaccinated parents, children, in general families with small children are hereby dispensed from the Sunday Mass obligation until further notice. As circumstances related to Covid protocols may vary from place to place, it is entirely at the discretion of parents as to whether or not they conclude that it is best to bring small children to Mass or to spend special prayer time with them at home on Sunday.
