WHO CAN NOMINATE A CANDIDATE?

The pastor may nominate up to two persons, including the board member whose term is expiring. Other nominations may be made in writing by at least 10 registered parishioners in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

All nominations are to be made at least 2 weeks before the election and announced at Sunday Masses two weeks prior to the election. If only one person has been nominated by then, the nominee shall be declared elected.

Senior, Erynn Maelaine Labut was born in Mesa Arizona. She has also lived in Queen Creek and Gilbert which she calls home living with her parents, Mary Jane and Gene, and younger brothers, Aiden and Donovan. Her choice to attend the University of Arizona was really made for her because this is the only Arizona school with an agricultural education major. A close look at Erynn's schooling shows a p arallel education of the Spirit. It's a clear-cut faith journey which was kick-started in the Summer of 2020, in the midst of the pandemic. Before this, Erynn had attended Mass and a reconciliation service, but this was not full participation. "I knew, thanks be to God, that the only way to keep the new fire for the faith was through the wonderful community that is Newman."



She dove fully into Newman with the Outreach and Liturgy

Committees and the Discipleship groups before serving as a Student Minister this year. She now helps to lead the Social Justice Committee and serves at Masses in different roles, attends Evening Prayer and Daily Mass as well as a Bible Small Group.

Erynn considers Newman her second family and jokes, when her Gilbert family comes to Tucson, that her two families will be visiting. Unofficial Newman picnics, baking cookies in the Newman kitchen for goody bags, retreats, praying Stations of the Cross at other Tucson parishes with friends, Newman Nights have strengthened the bonds with her second family. To them, she says, "I am enough. I am not an outcast. I am wanted, loved, seen. . .great conditions for me to flourish and become who I truly am, the Saint that God calls me to be daily. . . The St. Thomas More Community has blessed me with the greatest Catholic community I have ever been a part of>" Erynn hopes to graduate in Spring of 2022. In the meantime, you can see her "fire" in action at Mass or in the lobby or at a Newman event.
