Viv was a teacher, wife, is mother of 3, grandmother to 10, a widow, retiree, volunteer, new bride, and member of the permanent community at Newman. Born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania she along with her parents were active in the local Methodist Church. She earned her Bachelor's degree in elementary education at Bowling Green University in Ohio. Her training included a specialty in science and math which she used to teach 4th, 5th, and 6th graders. She married Jim McCarthy; they had 3 children. In 1989, Jim was transferred to Tucson and Viv continued to teach. She also took on "student status" earning a Master's degree through University of Phoenix and then a specialty degree from the University of Arizona in math. In 2007, after 41 years of marriage. Jim died suddenly of a heart attack.




In 2010, Viv retired, after 30 years in the classroom. She took up work with the Newman Sustaining Board almost immediately. There are many committees within the

board, but currently, Viv is chairiperson of the group looking for new members to add to its nearly 80+ membership total. It was through another board member that Viv was introduced to Steve Forgacs, a widower, whose wife, Pat, had also served on the Sustaining Board. Viv and Steve married in 2015. Both are involved in the work of the board which supports and promotes the work at Newman.

Their adopted parish is "home" and has sustained them too! Some of us remember, before Covid, that Viv's firefighter son died suddenly. She arranged for his funeral services to be held at Newman. "I love knowing the clergy which makes this church really feel like 'home' to us both." she says. Just as the Sustaining Board works behind the scenes to keep Newman vibrant, it seems that God has worked through Newman and its people to bless Viv and Steve. Their lives and work are outward signs of hope, love, and generosity among us.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today's Gospel reading from John recounts the familiar story of the wedding feast at Cana when Jesus launched His public ministry by performing His first miracle at his mother's request.

In the midst of the feast, the Blessed Mother noticed that the wine had run out and pointed out the problem to Jesus. Then, she gave the servants instructions that are equally applicable to us modern-day stewards, saying, "Do whatever He tells you." Jesus gives the servants a simple and seemingly mundane task, telling them to fill some stone jars with water. They did what He told them to do. And Jesus used their obedience in the accomplishment of that simple task to perform His first miracle, turning the water into the choicest wine.

Let us take care to listen to our Blessed Mother. Let us examine our lives this week to see if we really are doing whatever He tells us and cooperating with God to make the best use of the gifts He has given us for the benefit of those around us. If we all take this call seriously, He will perform miracles in our families and our parish.
