**Primary Function**: Under the direction of the Pastor and Business Manager, this position is responsible for performing a variety of maintenance duties in the parish, rectory, apartments and convent located at the St. Thomas More complex.

### **Essential Duties and Responsibilities**

- Perform in support of the Church's spiritual and pastoral mission

### GATHER THE PEOPLE; BREAK THE BREAD; TELL THE STORY.

Hollywood in the late 60s was the setting of David and Jordana Silvestri's first meeting. She and a friend were waiting for a ride at the bottom of a hill near Holywood and Vine. Enter: A "Greek god" on a Triumph 650 motorcycle. Jordana was first to hop on the back of the David's cycle and held on—she says they had a definite connection and exchanged phone numbers afterward. Two years passed without seeing each other again, though David called her number and only connected with her mother. One day, he called at a different time and Jordana answered; their whirlwind romance began. Two weeks later, they were married!

Tucson, Arizona in 1983, the University of Arizona Sikh Ashram needed renovation prior to being sold. David's expertise in renovation and construction brought him to their rescue. He and his family, now expanded by two children were allowed to live in the building during the remodel. This Ashram was located on the corner of 1 st St. and Cherry, just north of Newman. Their angels led Jordana to daily Mass at Newman and



a renewal of faith. She remembers Fr. Miguel and Fr. Mike along with Fr. Tom DeMan and Fr. Albert. The angels also showed David the way as he bacame the Newman maintenance expert for 17 years. In that time, Jordana also worked at The Sanctuary Beauty Studio as a stylist. There are many stories surrounding the Newman Center's people and events. Ask David about the 10 thousand dollar rummage sale or the planting of the gardenia bushes along the alleyside of the building and More! Engage this couple in Newman Memories—thanks to their angels, they witnessed a lot. It started in Hollywood!

### **Inspiring Black Catholic Americans**

**Venerable Henriette Diaz Delille (1813-1862)** Henriette Delille was a free woman of color born in New Orleans in 1813. She was a social worker and an educator. She worked with a friend to teach religion to slaves and to encouraged them have their unions blessed by the church. In 1835, Delille sold all of her property to start a community of Black nuns to teach free girls of color. After a few failed attempts, she and her friend founded the Sisters of the Holy Family in 1842. Although their primary work was education, Delille made it possible for the order to build a home for the sick, aged, and poor Black residents of the city and it became America's first Catholic home for the elderly. The Sisters heroically cared for the sick and the dying during the yellow fever epidemics that struck New Orleans in 1853 and 1897. In 1988, the canonization process for sainthood began when Pope John Paul II declared Sister Henriette Delille a Servant of God and Pope Benedict XVI decreed her venerable in March of 2010. Venerable Henriette Delille is the first U.S. native-born African American whose cause for canonization has been officially opened by the Catholic Church.

**Mother Mathilda Beasley** (Believed to be born in 1832-1903) While the cause for sainthood for this first Georgian nun is under review, her life and her achievements are remarkable. Throughout much of 19th century Georgia, black children were forbidden an education, those teaching would be heavily fined and flogged. Mathilda taught for many years in secret until 1860. She was baptized a Catholic in 1869, was married, then widowed, and bequeathed her inheritance to the Church, with the request to open an orphanage. She then joined the Order of St. Francis, where she devoted herself to keeping the orphanage running despite many obstacles.

#### **STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION**

In today's Gospel, taken from the sixth chapter of Luke, Jesus offers a very challenging, seemingly impossible approach to daily life. "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak do not withhold even your tunic." It makes one want to say, "Seriously, Lord?" And He doesn't stop there. Jesus adds, "Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back."

It seems so unfair! That is, unless we look at this way of life from a stewardship point of view. Then, not only does it seem doable (though challenging), but it also actually makes perfect sense. A steward understands clearly that all he has and all that he is — his very life — is a gift from God given to him from an unfathomable abundance of love. This changes everything! This means "my" cloak, "my" tunic, "my" money, and time — all of it ultimately belongs to God. He has entrusted these things to each of us in love to use for His purposes and His glory.




