
Inspiring Black Catholic Americans



Mary Elizabeth Lange was born around 1789 in Santiago de Cuba and was well-educated and wealthy when she arrived in Baltimore as a refugee. In 1828, with the help a priest, she and two other Black women started a school for Black Catholic children. In 1829 she and three other Haitian women made vows in what became known as the Oblate Sisters of Providence, the first religious order of women of African descent. Despite discouragement, racism and a lack of funds, the sisters continued to educate children and minister to the needs of the Black Catholic community. She died on February 3, 1882, but the Oblate Sisters continue.

Augustus Tolton was born a slave on April 1, 1854, in Brush Creek, MI. After the Civil War began, the Tolton family ran for freedom and settled in Quincy, IL. At age nine, Augustus was offered the opportunity to go to school by Fr. McGirr. The young boy was thrilled and became a brilliant student.

In the 1870s, when prejudice was basically taken for granted, after numerous rejections, Fr. McGirr was able to enroll Augustus in a seminary to study for the priesthood. In 1886, at the age of 32, Augustus Tolton, a former slave was ordained to the priesthood. Fr. Tolton died at the age of 43 in 1897. He was declared a Servant of God on Feb. 24, 2011, placing him on the road to canonization.

In the Gospel passage, from Luke, Jesus instructs Simon to lower his nets for a catch despite an unsuccessful night of fishing. Peter is skeptical but obeys and is amazed at the catch of fish that he makes. He kneels down before Jesus in astonishment.

This sense of awe and reverence before God should motivate us to deepen our stewardship way of life. As we contemplate the holiness of God, we come to a heightened awareness of what a privilege it is that He has chosen to include us in His work of spreading the Gospel to others through the grateful sharing of the gifts He has given us. Aware of this privilege, we will then make the words of Isaiah our own: "Here I am Lord, send me!"
