ountains in Scripture are places of Godly encounters. Many of the great heroes of the Bible were called to ascend a mountain to hear the voice of God calling, bestowing, directing, forming, and pointing them in some new direction. God showers down healing and new possibilities for all who are hungry for meaning, forgiveness, and reconciliation.... both within and beyond... our personal borders.

Today we hear about Abraham, Peter, James, and John.... How they were called from their ordinary experience.. into a place of transformational obedience and glory.

Abraham was called from a place of curious wandering.. into a loving relationship with the God of life. Abram who felt at times flat... discovered the power of new life, and received the stewardship of many nations.

This is what can happen when our ears and hearts are open... Abram, struggling to see his and Sarah's future..... had the courage to respond to God's promptings in his life. They listened to God's voice, and followed his requests.... even when it seemed against what they would have initially chosen to do. Abraham was "obedient" to God's commands, and God was abundant in His response to Abraham declaring him the "father of many nations."

In today's Gospel Peter, James, and John accompany Jesus on his journey up the mountain. In the midst of their conversation Jesus is "transfigured" before them, and they witness the 'divinity' that they have only 'experienced' behind the power of mighty words spoken... and deeds performed. As they encounter Jesus in this way, they are caught up in the 'glory' of those great figures in the Bible who have gone before them, and, who have been formed by the grace.. and discipleship of the Most High. Their response to this encounter is fear, wonder, and a greater desire 'to participate' in what they have been called to.

May our Lenten days be 'opportunities' to climb God's mountains. May our struggles up.... and through them... be places of surprising encounters, and, fresh new air. May we move from old behaviors that lead to death.... to ascending "heights" that bring greater truth and love.... to ourselves... and to those all around us. The Lenten Season calls us into abundance.. may we swallow it whole and entire.

May we let go of useless fears and climb into the "transformation" that comes when 'we wander with Jesus' into the heights of faith, hope, and love. Amen!

GATHER THE PEOPLE; BREAK THE BREAD; TELL THE STORY.

What kind of man loves his job so much that he's spent 55 years at it? He's showed up pretty much everyday. Meet Gilbert Duarte, a most likeable man—muy amable! How did he get that way? When he walks in the back of Newman for Mass, he has a smile, a hug, a quick word for the greeters. Maybe it was his upbringing—the 7 th of 7 children(3 boys and 4 girls)—born and raised in Tucson.

Maybe it was his education which took him through Mission View Elementary, Wakefield Jr. High and Pueblo High School. Because his parents divorced, there was no money for college, so he followed one of his sisters through Barber College; Kinchloe's downtown. Gilbert says in 55 years he has gone from "being the youngest barber to the oldest" in the shop. There is a generation gap but he keeps showing up!

Maybe his sister-in-law's invitation to attend church with her family at Holy Family Church helped to form him and his positive attitude. But after attending a few years, the pastor was moved; the new man was not the same. So, Gilbert found Newman with Fr. Fred, who was full of humor, and Fr. Albert, a good man. He found Newman to be small and comfortable. It was





comfortable enough to stay! He even fell into the old "won't you substitute for the donut man after Mass because he'll be out of town for just a little while. . . ." Gilbert became the "donut man" and covered that position for 20 years. Fr. Tom's Cafe has filled that same niche, which has a history.

Gilbert, who takes care of stray cats and dogs and , on occasion, people, says the great motivator in his life was "finding God." He celebrated 40 years of sobriety on February 14th of this year. Maybe that's why he has such a big heart and a great smile! His "take" on Newman today is with so many changes in 4 years, it's still Home, still Comfortable.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Jesus perfectly understands our humanity. He knows we need desert experiences — times of self-denial and testing — in order to arrive at mountain-top moments when we see and feel His glorious presence in our lives. The purpose of these two types of experiences is summed up in the description of the Apostles who were with Jesus at that mountain-top experience in today's Gospel: "Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep, but becoming fully awake, they saw his glory...."

The reason for all of our fasting and prayer and almsgiving during lent is to be reawakened to all God has done for humanity, and to all that He has done for each of us personally. It is all too easy to get lulled into complacency in our daily routines, to "sleepwalk" through life, getting up and getting ourselves out the door, going to work, returning home for dinner and dishes, meetings, or sports activities, and finally flopping on the couch to watch TV until bedtime. While there is nothing inherently sinful in this routine, as Christian stewards, we are called to so much more!

This lent, let us train ourselves, or more precisely, allow Him to train us to say "Yes" to His will and to offer our lives back to Him in gratitude. In so doing, we, too, will become "transfigured." This is what it means to live fully awake; this is a stewardship way of life and it is glorious indeed.
