Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Dear Newman Community: I hope that all students and others able to have a spring break were able have some time for a little rest and renewal. Here's an excerpt of a message posted by University of Arizona President Robbins on [Monday, March 14th](#):

Dear Students and Colleagues,

We are planning changes in face covering guidance for the University's locations in Pima County (including main campus) that will become effective next Monday (March 21st).

As I previously shared, we continue to monitor public health conditions in Pima County and throughout Arizona and follow CDC guidance released on Feb. 25, which suggests that the need for face coverings is reduced in areas with a low (green) or medium (yellow) Community Level. As of today, Pima County's level is medium, and I have been very pleased that data have shown a sustained period with fewer positive test results and hospitalizations.

With the return from Spring Break, and many students, faculty and staff traveling over the past week, I believe it is prudent to see what level of infection is present in our University community before changing the face covering protocol for Tucson locations, where the large majority of students, faculty, and staff are located. Following a week when University community members have an opportunity to test, if we see new case counts aligned with the rest of Arizona and Pima County, we will be well positioned to relax our mask protocol as suggested in the CDC guidance.

Thus, we anticipate masks will be recommended, but not necessary, in indoor spaces, including classrooms, for Tucson and other Pima County locations as of next Monday, March 21.

We will continue to monitor public health conditions for locations throughout Arizona and elsewhere. We will adjust protocols if we see an increase in testing positivity rates or if Community Levels return to high. Please continue to pay close attention to posted signage and online information for guidance on the use of face coverings, which will be updated as necessary for each location....

...As these changes go into place, I encourage individuals who are at higher risk of serious illness or who live with people in high-risk groups to continue to wear a surgical mask or higher-grade mask around others to limit their exposure to the virus.

Fellow members of our community might ask you to wear a mask when near them in a classroom, office, or meeting space. As always, I ask that you respect their needs and be mindful that others have varying levels of risk from COVID-19. Please contact the Disability Resource Center if you have questions regarding a disability or medical condition...

....Finally, if you have yet to be vaccinated or to receive a booster, I cannot encourage you strongly enough to make an appointment today through Campus Health or at other locations.

May the power of this Lenten Season renew our hearts, souls, and charitable action towards one another. May the peaceful conversation that ensued between the Samaritan Woman and Jesus serve as of model for the reduction of unnecessary wars and conflicts between peoples and nations. May our faith increase, our hope deepen, and our charity pour out this Lent and always. Amen.

Her father pointed her to THE MAN she would marry! Afterall, what Raul R. Gomez saw in Jay Bell was a handsome young bachelor working on his Masters Degree in Athletic Training. Raul, himself was a high school teacher and coach and he and wife, Ruth, had a beautiful daughter, Tina, of marriageable age. When Raul met Jay, assigned to the Sahuaro campus by the UA training program, he knew Jay would be his son-in-law.

Jay and Tina had a lot in common: both middle children of 3 siblings, college degrees, single, hard-working. Jay was born in Akron, Ohio and graduated from Kent State University. Tina was born in Tucson and attended public schools: Whitmore Elementary, Townsend Junior High and Catalina High earning her B.S. at the U of A.

After their wedding (40 years ago December of 2021) Jay and Tina moved to Lubbock, TX and then to Houston where he was engaged as an athletic trainer. They returned to Tucson and Jay was hired as trainer at Amphi High. Tina was employed by Amphi Schools in Human Resources and Pay where she stayed for 25 years. Jay, looking ahead, planned to go into the College of Pharmacy at the UA. He worked hard to pick up classes needed for that major—math and science at Pima College. For 14 years he has served in many different pharmacy areas. Currently, he is working with El Rio Health and Walmart Pharmacies.

Newman became home to Jay and Tina after the death, in 2000, of her parents, whom they cared for. At their joint Funeral Mass, Jay had a serious desire to receive communion. He kept hearing Ruth's voice telling him to become a Catholic, which he did in 2001 at Newman. They count the wonderful people, the spirituality of the friars and sisters, and the small community as reasons for their stayhere at Newman.

Until Covid, the Bells were active as Eucharistic Ministers with Tina counting collection monies and Jay also involved with the Knights of Columbus and Lectoring. At Covid Time, Tina had a serious health crisis which bowed her, but did not break her. Note: We are using Cycle A Readings for the 3rd, 4th & 5th Sundays of Lent in solidarity with our RCIA Elect

Our Gospel passage from John recounts the life-changing encounter Christ has with the Samaritan woman at the well beginning with His words to her, "Give me a drink." Then, He adds, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

Christ is speaking the very same words to us today. These two verses encapsulate the call to stewardship. Christ asks us to "give him a drink" by sharing what we have with Him and with others for His sake. Yet, it is Christ Himself who provides the water — the living water that is His grace.

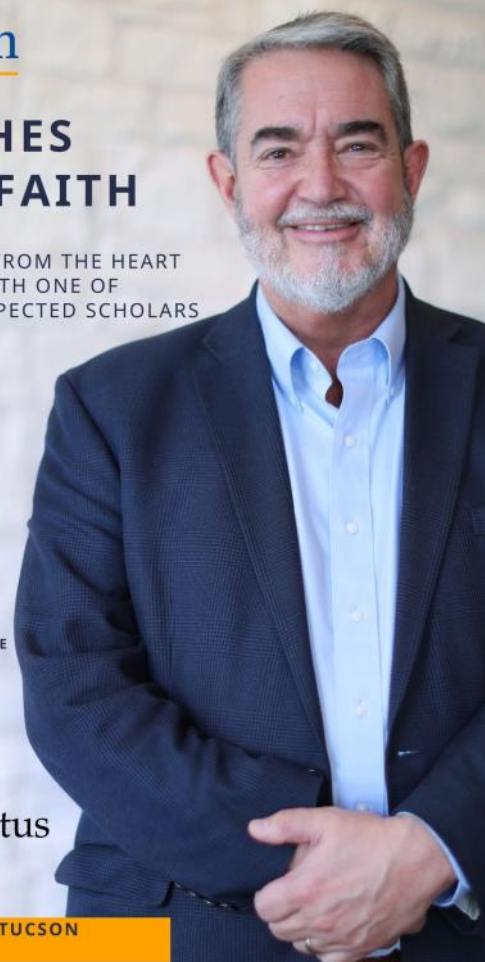
