GATHER THE PEOPLE; BREAK THE BREAD; TELL THE STORY.

Readers, Beware! The following is yet another Newman Love Story! Eileen Whalen, born in Mt. Vernon, NY and raised in Yonkers, was relocated to Tucson, AZ with family, as her parents were retiring and an Aunt already lived here. She graduated from Salpointe High School and the University of Arizona and Pima College. Her major was Nursing which opened the door to a career as TUSD school nurse and at St. Joseph's School too.

Of course, new college freshmen need a place to belong! (True in 1963 and true now.) That place was easily the Newman Center. This welcoming place provided a hangout in the lobby where new friends could meet after classes usually in the late



afternoon or early evening to discuss world events or philosophy. "New friends" included Bill Vasko, Rincon graduate, who is now Eileen's husband of 53 years and father to their 4 children.

Their journey through Newman saw Bill and Eileen graduate from the UA, marry, raise children, and teach in the CCD Program. Eileen taught CCD when her daughter was 6. (Now that daughter's child has been through the same program at Newman.) When the 4 children (all Salpointe and UA grads) were in Catholic elementary school, the Vaskos participated in school Masses and events, but "always ended up back at Newman." They can still be seen in attendance at Newman liturgies and activities.

One of their favorite memories is of Msgr. Stanley Powers, an early Chaplain at Newman, who loved to go hunting with Bill and loved Eileen's homemade bread. Other friendships made in their Newman College Days are still current—life-long connections. Bill and Eileen trusted that Newman was that "place to belong on a large and scary campus." The rest of their story mirrors God's Unconditional Love, returned a thousandfold!

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Jesus, by His own example in today's Gospel, demonstrates the necessity of setting aside a period devoted especially to prayer and fasting as a means of strengthening our spiritual muscles. Just before the launch of His public ministry, He is "led by the Holy Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil." In imitation of Jesus, we should ask the Holy Spirit to lead us into the desert, too — the desert of our interior lives where our thoughts and desires reside.

While our Lord was strong enough to withstand the temptations of the devil on His own, we most certainly are not! We must turn to the Holy Spirit and ask Him to show us where we need to grow, and then rely on the Holy Spirit for strength and guidance throughout these 40 days of growth. Perhaps we will be led to take on a spiritual reading program, or a daily time of meditation on the Scriptures. Maybe we'll be inspired to fast from our favorite food or social media fix and find a project that serves the poor in this community.
