# GATHER THE PEOPLE; BREAK THE BREAD; TELL THE STORY.

Lisa Marie Steenson, after years of attending elementary Catholic School and many classes in religious studies at the university level, has been challenged and formed by adversity, but has come home. Born in Danbury, Connecticut, she moved to Tucson at an early age with her parents, Bruce and Char. Soon she became the eldest of 3 children and began school at Helen Keeling Elementary. In third grade, she changed schools to SSPeter and Paul where she graduated from eighth grade. Despite her high profile volunteering at the Sacred Heart Parish Office, and hoping and wishing for the parish financial support to attend Salpointe High School, that dream did not materialize. She attended Amphi High School and graduated in 1988. Lisa found work at J. B.s Restaurant and also registered for classes at the University of Arizona.



It is here that she has a great story about meeting Fr. Bob Burns, O.P., world-renown religious scholar who taught at the UA Religious Studies Department for 40+ years. Some of us will recall the walk-through registration process where professors and staff sat by department in a large gymnasium or ballroom. Students would pick up


registration cards for each class, pay fees and have schedules completed. Lisa, saw a man in black, under the Religious Studies banner. Their eyes locked. He smiled, crooked an index finger inviting her to his desk. His class number was a 300 level, really, not a freshman choice! He urged her to sign up because he knew she could handle it and because he was the instructor. She did. She loved that and every class she took from Fr. Burns—Dr. Burns, after that first encounter.

In 1989-90, Lisa's life changed dramatically. She and a co-worker became romantically involved. As she puts it, "We were very young and dumb." Lisa became pregnant, got married and gave birth to a son. They moved to Phoenix where he worked, she took care of their baby and had 2 more children. After a couple of other moves, they returned to Phoenix.

In 2005, she enrolled at ASU. Lisa's UA credits transferred with her, many from the Religious Studies Department, and she earned a Bachelor's Degree in Interdisciplinary Studies in 2006.

Lisa's faith, hope and courage have been forged in difficult mental health issues. She had episodes of being very lost, literally and figuratively. She thanks her parents for "being her life raft." She thanks her, now adult children, Christopher, Cody, and Ciara for trusting in her. The love of 2 grandchildren extends hope in her life. She adds that Fr. Thomas Saucier, O.P. as well as Fr. John Paul and Sr. Angelica through their compassion and prayer have helped her immensely. Nine years ago, Lisa "came home."
