Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

This Sunday's Gospel is very familiar to us, and is a deep teaching on discipleship through Jesus's eyes.

A person approaches Jesus and says "What must I do to truly love God and to follow him with my whole self? Jesus quote the deep law - "Love God, neighbor, and self".

To justify himself the person ask Jesus who is my neighbor? Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan. It was a story for the hearers of his time that ended in a surprising way. The very person who should not have helped, did.... Namely, the Samaritan. There existed historical separation between Jews and Samaritans... Yet, this Samaritan only saw that a person had been beaten, robbed, and left for dead, and responded with care and charity.

There is a deep lesson for all of us who call ourselves Catholics, Christians, Lovers of God, or just good people. Following Christ, God, or the call to Goodness.... means always struggling towards it even with our fears, prejudices, ignorance, and lack of experience.

As we approach the Eucharist today.... May we receive Christ Jesus, and his power to remove and heal anything that separates us from being his real presence in the world. May we receive his call to move out of limited notions of discipleship to God's embrace of all people. Oh Lord, Increase our Faith! Amen!
