or the next three Sundays the Gospels will continue the themes of prayer, discipleship and stewardship. This Sunday, 7/24, the discipleship ask Jesus how to pray? Jesus tells them right way.... that when you pray establish a relationship with the Father.

Why is this important? It is important because when we have a good relationship with someone that is good... we can ask! And, we can ask with care and persistence. We see this in the first reading where Abraham kept asking God for mercy upon Sodom and Gomorrah for the sake of a few good people that lived there. True prayer allows us to speak and listen to God honestly and to persevere in all moments.

On Sunday, 7/31, we hear a wonderful parable about a man who has been blessed abundantly with grain... so much so that his storehouses are at the point of bursting! He like Martha from two weeks ago, is "anxious and upset" and concludes that the best solution is to take down his storehouses and to build bigger ones, so that in his old age he can sit back and relax.

Not a bad option! The problem comes in that he saw this as his ONLY option. What about sharing some of his bounty with others in need?

Especially, others who didn't have quite the blessings that he did? Wasn't that also an option? This parable reminds us of the importance of not allowing our successes to blind us from the needs of others. It's not like he

would not have had plenty of bounty in his old age. Sharing our resources helps others but also helps us to see our connection to all of humanity.

And, lastly Sunday, 8/7, celebrates our new yearly theme for the academic year 2022-23, "For where your treasure lies there also your heart will be".

We are all called to be good stewards of God's gifts to us. I am reminded of the great line from the Spider-Man comics "With great power comes

great responsibility" It's appears that this line has its basiss in Scripture.

Jesus reminds us in today's Gospel that our call and responsibility is from God, who is ALWAYS faithful. If we are to allow God's light to shine we must pray for the courage and strength to do this in all moments. Yes.... It's hard! But, not impossible with God's help in Christ, and the Holy Spirit!

May God's Grace be a treasure that always grounds our love and "increases our faith! Amen!

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

The Our Father is truly a steward's prayer. In it, we call upon God in an intimate way, as Father. We ask that His will be done (not ours!) and that His kingdom come (not ours!). In other words, we remember that He is our Creator, everything is His, and our focus in life should be on His priorities, not our own. Then we ask Him to supply our needs (to give our daily bread), forgive our sins, and protect us from evil. That is, we proclaim our complete trust in His provision for us and mercy towards us. We, too, commit to extending mercy ourselves (as we forgive those who sin against us).

As we pray the words of the Our Father, we recognize this basic truth about ourselves and God: God is our Father, and we are beloved and infinitely blessed to be His children. This is the basis of a stewardship way of life.
