GATHER THE PEOPLE; BREAK THE BREAD; TELL THE STORY.

She's tall, angular, energetic, a thoughtful, purposeful thinker, a listener, driven by ministry to others, wears black and white street clothes under a simple pageboy hairstyle. She is Sr. Lynn Allvin, O.P. whom Fr. John Paul named as Chaplain of our Newman Resident Community in February 2022. In addition, she will also be liaison for the young adult community and social justice undergrad committee.



Her early formation began within her childhood—born 3rd into a family of eventually 9 children to life-long service-oriented parents. They were an Air Force family whose father also worked as a government technical editor, pre-computers. They moved from Belleville, Illinois to Tucson when she was 5 years old. So, her early education was earned in Tucson up through sophomore year in high school at Sahuaro. However, the family moved to Lakeside, AZ where they all pitched in to work at the family business, renting cabins (more formation). She finished her high school education at Blue Ridge High School in Lakeside, and returned to Tucson at Pima College and the University of Arizona to study business. She heard a louder call to religious studies at San Jose State and entrance to the Oakford Dominicans in San Leandro, California's Bay Area. She furthered her education with a Master's Degree in Spirituality through Santa Clara College.

But, we can still confer "daughter of Arizona" status to Sr. Lynn as she has shared her ministry mostly in Arizona in Mesa at St. Timothy's Parish for 17 years (also where Tom Booth served) and Florence, in detention ministry for 11 years. Returning to Tucson for UA campus ministry seems to bring her full circle. There are many stories in Sr. Lynn's life so far—ask her about her Dominican Order, their home base, her family, her past ministries. Also, Sr. Lynn has extended an invitation to a July 16th Resident Community Meeting where we can get to know each other and see what this new relationship can bring to the Newman Center Community.
