Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

oday Gospel presents a dramatic expression of three well known parables. The lost sheep, the lost coin, and the man with two sons. Each parable expresses how different people react to something, and to someone being lost. Each story offers a surprising reaction to a loss that appears so "unusual" to Jesus' time, as well, as ours.

In all three cases, it seems like the main character's response is illogical, and not practical. What experienced shepherd would leave ninety nine sheep on their own, risking their lives, in search of 'the one' who always seems so problematic? What woman would obsess over a lost coin, worth less than five cents, and tearing her house apart until she finds? And, then call all of her friends over for a party? Or, what parent or guardian would keep reaching out to their son or daughter, who asked for their inheritance, prior to their own passing, (and, not their parent's deaths) only to leave home and to spend it all, and then ask to come home afterwards? Even if they did allow them to come home... would they throw a party, celebrating their embarrassment, and spending even more money, that they don't have, on a party for their town, that their resentful other son will not attend? All of this seems a little over the top, and not reasonable.

So often in life, we can be so busy with shoring up our own concerns.... that we give no, or very small attention to the "why" people are feeling lost or separated. It can feel like it's just too much, or just a burden! And, sometimes it is! But, what do we do in those moments?

The older I get.. the more I find myself praying for direction and strength. Answers are great, if they're the right ones... but, so often they're not.... which only leads to more stress and drama.

Today's Gospel teaches us that only love can heal life's deepest wounds and separations..... Walking the extra miles to find the lost; doing the deep cleaning and searching to find what is truly valuable to us; and staying connected to complicated relationships in our lives, that merit our faith, hope, and love.... if they are to continue.

It is 'this discipleship' of following God's lead.. that unties the knots from our lives.. and, allows the "Blessings" of being 'seen and found' to flow with abundance.

This is the "blessing" of discipleship... and, of allowing our lives to be formed by the Good Shepherd. God's grace is what helps our "hearts" to be in the right place, and to discover how to be calmer, more grounded, and peaceful!

May God's truth and love - transform our hearts, in and through the Holy Spirit..... May we make the time to create the proper "space" within the ground of our "hearts" for God's love and accompaniment to become a useful treasure, this semester, year, and beyond!


