#### GATHER THE PEOPLE; BREAK THE BREAD; TELL THE STORY.

Take 2 scrapbooks from the Newman Center. Place them side by side. One is a 1950-60s memory of the Newman Club created by students and including a picture of a young couple at a Newman 1960s dance. The other is a 2021-22 review of the Newman Center's people and activities created by Kiara Lane.

This UA art history major was inspired by the 70 year old memories hidden away in time. The most important memory, captured in a photo, was of her grandparents at a Newman Club dance, their first meeting. The John Lane and Jean Tonyan Lane marriage gave birth to children and grandchildren. Kiara Lane is one of those grandchildren! She was born and raised in Tucson, the eldest of 4 siblilngs, went to Ironwood Ridge High School and graduated in 2019. There is a Lane Legacy at Newman as her dad, David, also made Newman his "home."



Kiara's first encounter with Newman was at a Social Justice Committee meeting which

scared her away for months, but that is another story. Her social anxiety in tow, she decided to try a virtual retreat in 2020 during the pandemic. It was a powerful experience and she credits Kerst Kingsbury for introducing her to "an amazing community." As a result, she calls Newman "home"-- a place "where I can be myself and be part of a loving community that I am so grateful for." Grandpa John died in 2021, but he always remembered that first meeting with Jean, in a red dress, at the Newman Club dance. Ask Kiara to share those two scrapbooks with you! #### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

In our Gospel passage from Luke, the Lord shows us how to bridge the gap between worldly thinking and priorities and eternal thinking and priorities. Jesus tells the parable of the corrupt but clever steward who is about the get fired when the master discovers the steward has been squandering his property. Realizing his imminent unemployed status, the clever steward reaches out to the various debtors of his master to wheel and deal with them, making friends who would look out for him when he became jobless.

What if we put that kind of effort into our own tasks as good stewards of all God's gifts to us? Into our ministries, into the ways we could make more time for prayer as individuals, as couples, as families, and as a parish? What if we got as creative as the "bad steward" in the use of our finances so that we could give more generously to the poor and the advancement of God's kingdom on the earth?

That's our lesson and our challenge.
