Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Our Gospel for this weekend is taken from the eleventh chapter of the Gospel of Matthew, where John the Baptist has been arrested and 'questions' from his jail cell whether Jesus "is the one or should we look for another?"

When we find ourselves 'stuck' in our own 'self imposed' prisons... what do we do to 'free' ourselves, and to heal....., and to get back into life? What creates that wholeness... inspiration... or the 'freedom' to act... w/ purpose.... "as Jesus does.... with love, forgiveness, healing, and transformation?"

When John's inquiry is conveyed to Jesus, he does not respond theoretically, but rather by pointing to things that are happening, namely, God's grace is making people whole again....."Go and tell John what you hear and see:

the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. And blessed is the one who takes no offense at me."

Are we allowing ourselves to be made whole again, this Advent? To break the chains of unhealthy self doubt.. into the ability to allow "our questions" to be "transformed" into a healthy longing for God, and the "freedom" that comes from preparing our minds, hearts, and souls to receive his Blessings.... fully and with Gratitude.

As we move towards final exams, gradations, and this closing week, and last few days of Advent... May the "echo of Emmanuel" ring joyfully within us. May it clear away the clutter of my 'monkey minds' and usher in the "Peace and Blessings" of this Season of Grace!

On this third Sunday of Advent - let us "rejoice" in God's of promise to light our way through "darkness" with the voices of John the Baptist and Our Lady of Guadalupe, (whose feast day we remember today.) Her words to Juan Diego illumined his steps forward - when he was full of fear and doubt, and allowed him to feel his God given dignity, and to speak truth and charity to power. Let us pause for moment... and receive Our Blessed Mother's words:

"Hear me and understand well, my little son, that nothing should frighten or grieve you. Let not your heart be disturbed. Do not fear that sickness, nor any other sickness or anguish. Am I not here, who is your Mother? Are you not under my protection? Am I not your health? Are you not happily within my fold? What else do you wish? Do not grieve nor be disturbed by anything. Do not be afflicted by the illness of your uncle, who will not die now of it. Be assured that he is now cured. Climb, my dear son, to the top of the hill; there where you saw me and I gave you orders, you will find different flowers. Cut them, gather them, assemble them, then come and bring them before my presence.

We have been baptized in these same waters, and sealed with Holy Spirit! We have been wrapped (as Juan Diego was) in the same mantel of loving protection by Our Blessed Lady.....

May we go forth unburdened.... from the weight... of all that scatters our clarity, and seeks to create darkness, drama, and useless fear in our lives.

May we join John the Baptist in "Preparing the Way of the Lord... in our Tucson Desert.... "For where your treasure is, there also your heart will be! Amen!

CASA ALITAS OUTREACH OPPORTUNITY

After arriving in the US, they have been granted humanitarian parole and are here legally to await an asylum hearing. Casa Alitas volunteers offer support by providing hospitality, including food, shelter, advocacy, and travel assistance. Our goal is to provide a comfortable, healthy location for travelers to await their journeys and to prepare them for a safe trip.
