

After 3 years, they returned stateside to Alabama and then on to Bermuda, 2 years. The travels continued to Texas, 4 years, before he retired from his officer active duty and moved to Highland CA.

It was here that Courtney enjoyed uninterrupted high school years and continued on to college at Cal State in San Bernadino. She earned a bachelor's degree and a love of hiking. Some of her family settled in San Diego. So did she, for 3 years, then to Los Angeles working as a field insurance claims-adjuster. After many years in that industry, she and her daughter moved to Roseville, CA where a recession impacted available jobs.

In 2018, she moved to Tucson where she works for Pima Community College with the Student Success Department working with freshmen and sophomores teaching and preparing them for transferring to the U of A.

Courtney spends her spare time hiking, swimming, and working out at the gym. Her daughter is married now and lives in Southampton, England. Their recent Christmas visit in CA ended with Courtney being stranded in the airport for a few days and a harrowing auto trip back to Tucson with others whom she met at the airport—but that is a story for her to write as she loves creative writing and has published online. [Casa Alitas](#), located near Kino and Ajo Way, serves migrant families who have left their home countries to escape violence and poverty. After arriving in the US, they have been granted humanitarian parole and are here legally to await an asylum hearing. Casa Alitas volunteers offer support by providing hospitality, including food, shelter, advocacy, and travel assistance. Our goal is to provide a comfortable, healthy location for travelers to await their journeys and to prepare them for a safe trip.
