ositive Encounters can change our lives for the better. What a gift it is to go into a service establishment and to be treated with kindness and respect. When we walk into a restaurant, hospital, supermarket, or church... and are received well... we return, and tell others about our good experience.

In today's Gospel, "The Woman at the Well" Jesus exercises good engagement skills - in an encounter that had all the potential to go poorly. The woman and Jesus are from different cultures and social classes, and shouldn't be interacting in the first place, but they are! They are engaging in a deeper conversation, and learning more about one another.

The conversation concludes with the Samaritan woman asking Jesus "Give me this water - that I may not have to come to this well". Through this "strange" encounter.... the Samaritan woman's deep thirst for love, and inclusion.... is beginning to find a path to healing.... As she and Jesus walk into deeper dialogue... more freedom is the result....., as well, as a greater clarity.... about what 'truly' quenches a "human and spiritual" thirst, and provides contentment.

The Samaritan woman departs Jesus's presence "leaving her water pitcher behind" Why.....? because she has received 'hydration' from a divine source..... 'God's Word In Christ.... And this..... feeds her soul, and compels her to share what she has received with others.

What heavy water jars are we carrying around? And, what are we filling them with? Are we getting our thirst quenched, or desiring some better?

May our Lenten journey lead us... to those people and places where we may encounter the Spirit of Truth, and the Love of God!

May we become more engaged, reflective, and honest.... in our growing relationship with Christ.... May our prayer deepen in its quality; our fasting yield a healthy growth in areas that need change, and our almsgiving create a greater generosity towards others.

These "encounters" are "blessings" that fuel our forward movement through life. May God's accompanying Spirit give us the grace to quench our true thirst, and invite others 'peacefully' to do the same..... May our prayerful and healthy discernment of our physical boundaries through these days not separate us from the "Blessings" that await those open to receiving God's truth and love this Lent.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Our Gospel passage from John recounts the life-changing encounter Christ has with the Samaritan woman at the well beginning with His words to her, "Give me a drink." Then, He adds, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

Christ is speaking the very same words to us today. These two verses encapsulate the call to SteWardship. Christ asks us to "give him a drink" by sharing what we have with Him and with others for His sake. Yet, it is Christ Himself who provides the water — the living water that is His grace.
