alm Sunday recalls Jesus coming into Jerusalem and being received joyfully as "The One" who is to come and to restore Israel.

There was a hope and expectation - that Jesus was the leader who was going to "with force" and "Aggression" deal with the Romans and all who were 'contrary' to what "God's chosen" had been waiting for 'generations' to have restored. 
