s we celebrate Father's Day... May the grace of the Holy Spirit surround all Dads, Grandads, Stepdads, and any Father-figures in our lives. May they experience the Spirit of Truth and the Love of God in their lives, and be protected as they care for all of us!

Unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood you will have no life in me". A powerful statement from last Sunday's Gospel. Corpus Christi - the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ!

As the Spirit of the Lord continues to shower down upon each of us.. so, does the call to be united and fed "in Christ".
