Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

hat a recognizable human experience....
We're asked to do something that we're not feeling.... and we either complain, or rebel.... or both! It's hard to move from comfort, to engagement.... especially, if that engagement is not something that we want to do. Initially this can be unsettling.... We have to think about it, let it soak in, and see if it delights or bothers us.... And, after all that... then we have to see... if there is some 'value' to doing or not doing.. what we've been asked to do? All is this is called DISCERNMENT.... and it is very 'helpful' in our lives towards discovering what is helpful, true, and needed.... to be peaceful people.

In today's Gospel, Jesus uses this parable to underscore the importance of being intentional. Do we know what we are saying yes, and no, to? Saying yes, and no ...both involve 'energy'..... And, it is this 'well-discerned' energy in today's Gospel - that allows the first son in the parable... to reflect and 'otherwise' about his initial response, to breathe... and to return and to right thing. In the case of the second son, there is no discernment, so there is no proactive or helpful response to his father. He ends up ignoring the whole request.

In our culture of busyness it's easy to become judgmental about what people are doing, and not doing. Discernment reminds us to truly "mind" our own business' and, to ask.... Am I loving God, others, and myself with my whole person... mind, body, heart, and strength! Amen!



CASA ALITAS OUTREACH OPPORTUNITY

Casa Alitas needs community support to serve migrant individuals and families fleeing their home countries to escape violence and poverty. The individuals served by Casa Alitas have been granted humanitarian parole by Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and they are allowed to remain in the U.S. to await their asylum court date. The stop-over at Casa Alitas is a brief respite en route to their final destinations with family or sponsors.

Casa Alitas is largely volunteer-run. If you are interested in community service, the Newman Center leads volunteers on the 1st Thursday and 3rd Saturday monthly. Volunteers create a safe and welcoming space for guests. Opportunities include guest intake, food service, clothing donation room, laundry and linen support, arts and activities for children, travel planning, and airport escort.
