OTHER HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE YEAR



- Average weekend Mass attendance: 476, an increase of 11% from 2022 according to the October Counts
- Weekly participation at Liturgy of the Hours and Daily Mass increased by six percent
- Weekly participation at Newman Night for Undergrads and the Young Adult Community increased by 10%
- 60+ undergrads attending weekly bible studies led by the Torch Team
- 48 Undergrads participated in the Fall Retreat, 44 in the Spring Retreat
- 22 Young Adults participated in the Spring YAC Retreat
- 31 Undergrads were formed as leaders through the Student Ministry Team and Torch Team
- Transitions in staff included a farewell to the Mission San Jose Dominican Sisters
- Sr. Lynn Allvin, OP was named Chaplain to the Resident Community
- Resident Community Small Groups were launched, Lenten Days of Reflection were hosted, and cross-generational assistance at Casa Alitas was formed
- Sr. Mary Elizabeth Lawrence, SC was hired as Office Manager, forming a partnership with the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill
- The Newman Center assisted with coordination of the campus Prayer Vigil and local remembrance services for Dr. Thomas Meixner
- In November 2022, the Newman Center hosted the annual Campus Ministry Meeting for the Western Dominican Province with Friars and Staff from Las Vegas, Oregon, Stanford, Utah and Washington in attendance
- Funding from the Catholic Foundation's Annual Catholic Appeal provided new flooring downstairs in Bishop Green Hall
- A Partnership was formed with the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) to receive five FOCUS Missionaries in the Fall of 2023
- Approval was received from the Diocese of Tucson's Building Committee for the Dominican Common Room Project and a desire for a global plan for the entire Newman Campus in anticipation of its centennial celebration in 2026. The Dominican Common Room Project is now in the permitting phase

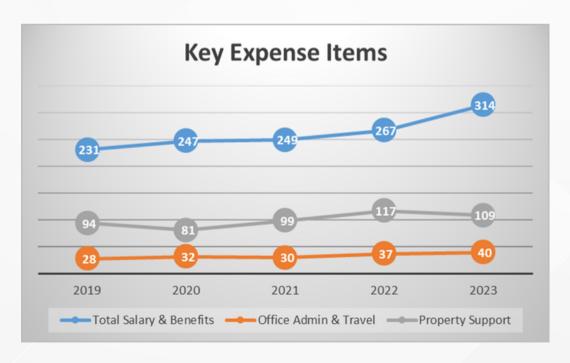

PASTORAL GOALS FOR 2023-2024



- Increase weekly Offertory Collections to meet budgeted amounts. The average goal is \$10,000 each weekend, an increase of \$1000 needed at minimum
- Increase larger contributions, both Restricted and Unrestricted, to meet budgeted amounts. Intentional asks to alumni, parents and other legacy donors will be led by the Pastor in coordination with the Stewardship Committee
- Finalize bid process for the Dominican Common Room Project to determine final price of the project. \$322K+ was already raised thanks to your generosity making it possible to break ground in early 2024.
- Recruit new members for the Stewardship Committee with an emphasis on Marketing, Development, and the ability to help us with mailing correspondence and interaction with our donors & volunteers
- Recruit new members for the Finance Council with an emphasis on fiscal analysis and data entry
- Re-convene a Grounds Committee with an emphasis on providing direct support to facility maintenance and upkeep, developing a global plan with actionable items and budget estimates
- Convene a Newman Centennial Planning Committee in preparation for 2026 celebrations
- Integrate a shared formation approach for our leaders in the Student Ministry Team and the Torch Team
- Develop intentional support and timelines for progress with the Knights of Columbus Council #16061, Dominican Laity and the Thomistic Institute
- Prayerfully and intentionally welcome the team of five Missionaries from FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students) so they can enhance our existing ministries and outreach to the campus
- Promote ongoing participation in wider church initiatives such as the Synod on Synodality, the Eucharistic Revival and developing the Order of Preachers' global approach to Catholic Campus Ministry
