Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

o be awake and sober.... To be ready to go when God calls us....

The older I get, the more I am in search of meaningful conversations and relationships.

There are so many words spoken, written, emailed, texted, tweeted and broadcasted at all hours of the day and night. We are soaked with information about everything and everyone. In some ways... this is a gift to have so much 'ease of communication' at our disposal.... In other ways, it is exhausting.... to have to process so much information either willingly or passively.

In our first reading from the Book of Wisdom... we hear that "wisdom" is "resplendent and unfading; readily perceived by those who seek her, and found by those who look for her; that she can be discovered at the dawn... waiting by the gate.... for all in search of her"

Wisdom goes beyond simple information... It is the fruit of our discernment and 'wading through' all that knowledge provides through our information sources. Wisdom is 'a call to pray' ...over and over... with the knowledge that we gather.... and to see what *light 'rises' from it... 'to illuminate our way forward' into loving action in the world.

In our Gospel there are wise and foolish people hoping to meet the bridegroom. The wise are those who took the time to be prepared... Those who allowed themselves to awake up, and to sober up.... so that they were not distracted by the chaos, that can sometimes be a part of life, so, that they were 'ready to go' when the time came to do so.

May we have the courage, to love God, with ALL that we are, lifting the fog.... of too much information. May we focus on being 'awake and sober' to receive God's love and wisdom.... in our dreams and plans.





CASA ALITAS OUTREACH OPPORTUNITY

Casa Alitas needs community support to serve migrant individuals and families fleeing their home countries to escape violence and poverty. The individuals served by Casa Alitas have been granted humanitarian parole by Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and they are allowed to remain in the U.S. to await their asylum court date. The stop-over at Casa Alitas is a brief respite en route to their final destinations with family or sponsors.

Casa Alitas is largely volunteer-run. If you are interested in community service, the Newman Center leads volunteers on the 1st Thursday and 3rd Saturday monthly. Volunteers create a safe and welcoming space for guests. Opportunities include guest intake, food service, clothing donation room, laundry and linen support, arts and activities for children, travel planning, and airport escort.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Jesus teaches the importance of wisdom in our Gospel passage from Matthew. He tells the parable of ten virgins awaiting the arrival of the bridegroom who will welcome them in to the wedding feast. Five of the virgins were foolish and five were wise. The foolish virgins failed to bring oil along with their lamps when they went to meet the bridegroom. The wise ones, however, had prepared and brought sufficient oil to keep their lamps lit when the bridegroom came. The foolish virgins, caught off guard, ran off to buy more oil, but they were too late. The door to the wedding feast was locked to them. Jesus cautions, "Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

The stewardship way of life — with its daily and weekly commitments to giving God the best of our Time, Talent, and Treasure — is the "oil" that we keep with us at all times. When we have this plan in place and we rely deeply on the Holy Spirit to guide us through the twists and turns of each day, we are free, we are ready to answer the Bridegroom when He calls us. We live in wisdom.
