

ollywood has released another iteration of Alice Walker's award-winning novel 'The Color Purple' which follows the lives of a poor black woman and her family growing up in the South with poverty, abuse, racism, and other surrounding issues.

A powerful part of this story is how the story is told... it is in Celie's "Dear God" letters - which is the main way that she copes with all the sufferings, disappointments, and ultimately the freedom that comes when she realizes that although life can feel impossible at times.... God still called her name... and her life.... into being, and.... that she is "here".

In our first reading... God is calling young Samuel who is sleeping in the temple area not far from Eli his mentor. "Samuel, Samuel....." Out of "obedience" (deep listening) Samuel rises immediately and goes to Eli and asks.. "Did you call me? To which Eli says "no, go back to sleep" And, this happens two more times until finally, Eli begins to "listen harder" and realizes that it is God who is calling Samuel.

So, like in today's Gospel Eli, like John... sends young Samuel, as John "sends" Andrew and the other disciple - to receive Jesus's invitation to "Come and See"

This is the 'power of contemplative prayer... learning over time how to listen deeply for God speaking... in creation, in and through reconciliation of ourselves.... and/or in relationships.... and, in the 'power of sanctifying grace in the Spirit... who calls, stirs, and directs.. our "gifts".... towards good and proper use - for ourselves, others, and in all situations.

Today's readings remind us that God is always at work..... calling, inspiring, moving, healing, forgiving, and sustaining us..... We only need to "Come and See" For "Maybe.... God is trying... to tell us something"

As we move into a new semester... may we ask for the courage and the stamina.... to listen and to love God... with EVERYTHING! All of our heart, mind, soul, and strength.... As well, as our neighbor and ourselves. Amen!

VATICAN OBSERVATORY OFFICE PART-TIME JOB OPPORTUNITY

The Vatican Observatory Foundation is a 501©(3) non-profit corporation with its headquarters in Tucson, Arizona. It is dedicated to supporting the research and works of The Vatican Observatory, whose world headquarters is at Castel Gandolfo, outside of Rome, Italy, and the Observatory's Research Group at The University of Arizona. The Foundation has a majority ownership interest in the Vatican Advanced Technology Telescope, which is part of the Mt. Graham International Observatory.

The Foundation is in need of a part time administrative support person, to be compensated

on an hourly basis or on such terms as the Foundation and assistant may agree. It is expected that the position would require the successful applicant to work 8 to 16 hours per week. The Foundation expects to be setting up a new office space in Tucson and the successful applicant will have some duties in connection with the set-



CASA ALITAS OUTREACH OPPORTUNITY

<u>Casa Alitas</u> needs community support to serve migrant individuals and families fleeing their home countries to escape violence and poverty. The individuals served by Casa Alitas have been granted humanitarian parole by Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and they are allowed to remain in the U.S. to await their asylum court date. The stop-over at Casa Alitas is a brief respite en route to their final destinations with family or sponsors.

Casa Alitas is largely volunteer-run. If you are interested in community service, the Newman Center leads volunteers on the 1st Thursday and 3rd Saturday monthly. Volunteers create a safe and welcoming space for guests. Opportunities include guest intake, food service, clothing donation room, laundry and linen support, arts and activities for children, travel planning, and airport escort.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

"Speak, for your servant is listening." With those few words, Samuel humbles himself and declares his loyalty and obedience to God. There are perhaps for many of us challenges in those words. Initially, Samuel responds, "Here I am," but thinks it was Eli who called him. The idea of being a servant and the willingness to serve are what may be trials for us in terms of how we live.

Samuel does not recognize the voice of the Lord. That, too, might be a problem for us. First, we need to be listening. Are we, or are we merely going through the motions? Responding to God with "Here I am" is a magnificent way to react to God. It is not that God does not know where we are but saying that can serve as a reminder to us that we are stewards and servants to Him, and it implies we are prepared to hear what He wants us to do.
