Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

he Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan.....

Another Lenten Season begins. We've received our ashes; and now are struggling to embrace some practice.... To direct us towards greater freedom in our lives; and, to commit ourselves... towards growing..... in the areas of prayer, fasting, and...., greater generosity towards others.

These are all... good things... designed to help us to create.. more space... in ourselves ... for listening, learning, and living more free.

Prayer invites us..... to be driven into the desert as Jesus was.... There to be confronted with, and in, ourselves... the strong and weak; the grounded and messy;w/ our good behavior.... as well, as our most unhealthy.

Prayer... teaches us.... to listen.. attend... and to simply breathe..... It shows us.....that cultivating a deep relationship with Christ, in God through the Holy Spirit... is both a gift.... And, lasting and benefit.

Fasting... is so much more.... than refraining from chocolate. Yes, this can be a start... but it is so much more... Fasting invites us.... reflect deeply... upon what.... might be an unhealthy attachment.... in our lives.... that is leading us to us to ruin....and not to flourish.

CASA ALITAS OUTREACH OPPORTUNITY

<u>Casa Alitas</u> needs community support to serve migrant individuals and families fleeing their home countries to escape violence and poverty. The individuals served by Casa Alitas have been granted humanitarian parole by Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and they are allowed to remain in the U.S. to await their asylum court date. The stop-over at Casa Alitas is a brief respite en route to their final destinations with family or sponsors.

Casa Alitas is largely volunteer-run. If you are interested in community service, the Newman Center leads volunteers on the 1st Thursday and other times monthly. Volunteers create a safe and welcoming space for guests. Opportunities include guest intake, food service, clothing donation room, laundry and linen support, arts and activities for children, travel planning, and airport escort.
