Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

he two powerful stories in our Sunday Readings today remind us that God is deeply interested and is invested in our lives. Especially, if we are willing to walk with Him.

In the "Ten Commandments" God lays out clearly what it means to be in relationship with Him, and with one another. In the first three "Commandments" we are to know, love, and serve God - above all persons and things. To keep His name, day, and our relationship to Him - both - precious and respected. In the remaining seven "Commandments" we are "to love our neighbor as we love ourselves" by being good stewards of one another's person, lives, relationships, and goods.

For to Love God above all things... is also to allow ourselves to be 'soaked in' His 'Love and Friendship'.

God's "Commandments" are not about being enslaved, but rather about celebrating the call to walk with Him daily, and to share the fruits of this encounter..... with others.

This is what it means to 'walk in the light of God' and, to be grounded.... in truth and beauty.

Jesus, grounded deeply - in the Father and Spirit - could not help but to react when walked into the temple in Jerusalem.

His 'reaction' which to our hearing - may appear to be intense - is more of a reflection of the Living God - who does not suffer humanity choosing the lesser road lightly.

'Don't make Godly places.... NOT what they are NOT..... supposed to be'... whether they are in a sacred space of a temple or church.... OR, the sacred space of another person's dignity, community, or the temple of our bodies or lives. The commandments are reflected in the Greatest commandment:

"Love the Lord your God with your whole heart, soul, mind.. and strength...... And, love your neighbor as you love yourself".

As we continue upon our Lenten journey may we keep walking with..... in.... along.... and besides..... God, and one another. Amen

CASA ALITAS OUTREACH OPPORTUNITY

<u>Casa Alitas</u> needs community support to serve migrant individuals and families fleeing their home countries to escape violence and poverty. The individuals served by Casa Alitas have been granted humanitarian parole by Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and they are allowed to remain in the U.S. to await their asylum court date. The stop-over at Casa Alitas is a brief respite en route to their final destinations with family or sponsors.

Casa Alitas is largely volunteer-run. If you are interested in community service, the Newman Center leads volunteers on the 1st Thursday and other times monthly. Volunteers create a safe and welcoming space for guests. Opportunities include guest intake, food service, clothing donation room, laundry and linen support, arts and activities for children, travel planning, and airport escort.
