Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

I am the bread of life.”

Over the next few Sundays, Jesus, as the “bread of life” will be a major theme. He will refer to himself this way, and connect his words to the experience of Moses and the Israelites being fed by God in the desert. He will refer to himself and his ministry, preaching, and presence among the people... as the “true bread” come down from heaven.

The people will be both curious, and bothered by Jesus’s language and invitation to feed on Him, and to find a life that will last forever.

As we listen to the power and depth of these words proclaimed by the Gospel of John... May we have the courage to ask the Holy Spirit to teach us anew... of the profound power that can come to us through the Eucharist. We have to allow our spirit to be engaged, as well, as our minds to encounter the love of God, in Christ that comes to us in this Sacrament. The people who heard Jesus speak could not allow themselves to go beyond simply the physical to the spiritual truth that he was pointing them to. Yes, it was confusing, and disorienting.... But, so is life, at times..... And, we have to have a path that helps us through moments when we experience truth, but fear the pathway to the truth that we are seeking.

May our journey through these “Bread of Life” Sundays... be not only a source for confusion, but an opportunity for us to grow in our relationship with Christ, intellectually, personally, and spiritually.
