

Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

he older I get the more I feel the need to eliminate unnecessary drama from my life. I believe that life's too short to sweat the small stuff!

That being said, I'm not suggesting that we ignore important smaller matters in our lives that are necessary for good communication and healthy living... these are: prayer, rest, friendship, good company, good self care and stewardship of our mental health is required if we are to have the ability to hear and discern God's voice speaking and guiding our life.

In today's Gospel Jesus asks "who do others, and you say that I am? Peter who normally might not think before speaking says..... "you are the Christ! He doesn't sweat the small stuff in that moment. Later when Christ describes his wider mission... Peter does. True discipleship means "taking up our cross daily... and being willing to lose our life (and bad ego) daily.

This means discovering what blocks, hinders, and confuses true prayer which is meant to brings us into closer relationship with God, in Christ, through the Holy Spirit. When this is happening... we are breathing in God's life, Christ's friendship, and the Holy Spirit's accompaniment. This is "who" God is... Life, Love, Mercy, Truth, Hope, and Peace... and more than we can think or imagine!

It is this grace in life that allows us not to split "faith and works" but to see them as absolutely necessary for following and participating in ministry of Jesus the Christ!

When this grace finds a home in us.... we can "Love our enemies, do good, and expect nothing in return! Amen!

"You are the salt of the earth." "You are the light of the word."


We are called in two ways: to be the salt of the earth—to provide the flavor of life to others—and to be the light of the world to be like Christ, to radiate God's love to others.


How to report abuse
