Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Be opened is a powerful line from this Sunday's Gospel. Jesus receives a person who is unable to hear and who has trouble speaking because of this. Jesus takes the man into his care, and away from the crowd, and touches his mind, heart, body, and soul... seeking the deep cause of his infirmity. Is it physical, emotional, intellectual, or spiritual? Some of the above? All of the above?

After this deep laying on of hands, we are told that he "looks up to heaven and groans and says to the person, "Ephphatha" that is "Be opened! And, that the man was immediately healed in hearing, and spoke clearly.

God desires as we heard in today's first reading that we "Be strong, and fear not! That the eyes of the blind will be opened; and the ears of the deaf will be cleared; that the crippled walk; the mute will speak; that spring waters will burst forth in the desert, and that burning sands will become pools, and that thirsty ground will be served by cool springs of water" All of this is to say... that God desires us to be whole, happy, and peaceful.

We are called in two ways: to be the salt of the earth—to provide the flavor of life to others—and to be the light of the world to be like Christ, to radiate God's love to others.


And as Catholics, we accept the gifts of grace and faith bestowed on us, but we also know that our faith must be demonstrated through our works (James 2:18).


