Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

o give from our need, and not just from our surplus" To give a proper gift to someone is an art form. Have you ever received a gift, and then said thank you sheepishly?

Thinking to yourself, "what were they thinking? or, how can I recycle this? We've probably all had this experience at least once or twice? It's not the worse thing that could happen to you, but it's always a little memorable, especially when you compare that to receiving a thoughtful gift... One that strikes you - in your heart, mind, and soul... There's no comparison! Someone took the time to 'really' think about 'their gift-giving' and, gave us a gift from their heart, and from discernment... and, not just from their 'surplus' and, not really seeing what was needed, but just responding.

To really give... takes energy... whether this is from our time, talent, or treasure... It takes courage, and real generosity to give. In today's Gospel... a poor widow... who did not have any kind of a surplus... but gave from a place of real generosity! She offers - from a different kind of surplus... namely, the 'treasure in heaven' which she has built up in this life. What is this treasure? It's the treasure that comes from loving God with all that we are, and allowing this to inform our actions.

It's 'giving' out of that place which says that God's Spirit is really upon me, and with me... and, that feeling this touch... allows me - to move through this life with faith, hope, and love... into any situation... Especially, tragedies, losses, and surprises... With courage! This is all... that the widow had to give..., and she gives it freely!

In the first reading Elijah asks the widow to give even though her situation appears to be absolutely dire... why is this? Because often when we find ourselves in the most desperate of situations, it is then that we are the most open to God... who is pure gift, and calls us to us... because God's gift of grace - never runs out!

What might the world look like - if we gave from this place of deep generosity? Making the time to go the extra mile, now and then, and not simply complaining about the distance that we have to go. Giving in this way, invites a certain intentionally into our sharing... It helps us to pause..., accessing the need..., and to ask ourselves... is my response from my surplus..., or from my need? Surplus giving without knowing the 'why'... can be helpful to the survival of buildings, programs, and people... Giving from our 'need' always invites us... to the 'why' we are giving..., grounding us in the theological virtues (of faith, hope, and love) and allows our sharing of our personal time, talent, and treasure - to impact others, and ourselves... - in useful ways..., that are helpful... to the building up of others, and the Kingdom of God.

The love of God is given to us, not just forourselves... but to be given away. The Spirit of the Lord is upon us... May we have the courage... to be generous... in sharing the anointing blessing... that we have received... with others!

Amen. Alleluia
