I God. This included his circumcision and dedication to the glory of God. In our own Christian baptism, we too are presented before the community. Our names are spoken, our parents and godparents are questioned, and our foreheads are anointed with the sign of the Trinity. We are claimed for Christ, cleansed with water, sealed with the sacred chrism, and dressed in new garments-symbols of the new life we are given in the family of Jesus Christ.

In today's Gospel, Mary and Joseph are amazed by the words of Simeon, the High Priest, who declares, "Now I can rest in peace, because my own eyes have seen the salvation promised through the prophets." The presentation of Jesus was not just a ceremonial act; it was the dawning of God's promised salvation, revealed to the world through the presence of the infant Jesus. In this presentation, everything is being transformed-the world, creation itself, is being made new.

As baptized members of Christ's body, we too are "children of the light." But how will we allow that light to shine? I believe the answer lies in how we actively participate in the gifts we received at baptism-how we let those gifts stir within us and transform the world around us. When Mary and Joseph hear about their son and his mission, they take it deeply to heart. Mary even "ponders" these things in her heart. May we, too, ponder the blessings we've received in our own baptism and present that peace to others.

This month, as we also observe Black History Month, let us reflect on the profound contributions of our African American brothers and sisters. As the old spiritual says: "Guide my steps, Lord, while I run this race, cause I don't want to run this race in vain." May we honor their enduring faith, strength, and resilience, and allow their example to inspire our own walk of faith.

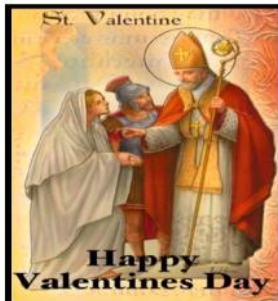

February 2 **Wilton Daniel Gregory** (1947-)

Catholic Priest/First African American Cardinal in the United States/Archbishop of Washington, DC **"I have to try to remind people on both sides of the barque of Peter that there is room for us all and that we are not the first generation of Catholics to experience serious theological and pastoral differences of opinion. In fact, from the New Testament, strong leaders within the church disagreed openly. February 6 **Bryan Massingale** (1957-)

Catholic priest/author/ activist/ theologian

"Thomas Aquinas taught us that courage is the precondition of all virtue. Without courage... We're not able to be just, because courage is that virtue that allows us to surmount the fear that comes with the following of the Gospel. If we're going to do anything that is difficult, there is going to be hesitation; there are ongoing obstacles and opposition, and the fear that those obstacles engender in us. Courage is that virtue that enables us to not be afraid."

February 4 **Jacob Lawrence** (1917-2000)

Painter/best known works, The Migration Series which depicts the migration of African-Americans from the rural south to the urban north.

"I'd like them to experience the beauty of life, the struggle, how people can overcome certain things that could be frustrating or very demeaning," he explained. "People have the capacity to overcome these obstacles by various means, and this is an example of that... I'm talking about people in general; I'd like it to be a universal statement."
