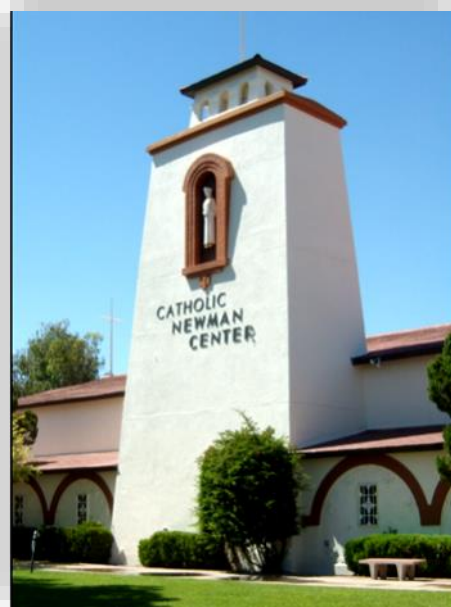

## Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Jesus asks his followers, “Who do people say that I am?” There’s a buzz all around—people wondering, speculating, naming and labeling. But then Jesus turns to his closest companions and goes deeper: “But who do you say that I am?”

Peter, speaking from the gut of his experience—his walk with Jesus, his love, his awe, and even his confusion—responds with raw faith: “You are the Christ, the Anointed One, the Son of the Living God.” It’s a bold profession—real, full-bodied, and still searching. Peter believes, even though he doesn’t fully understand what that belief will come to cost or call forth from him.

Paul, too, is confronted with a life-defining question. “Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?” That question pierces him. It shakes loose his assumptions and drives him toward a deep conversion. He receives a new name—and more than that—a new heart, a new mind, and a new way of seeing. In turning toward Christ, Paul becomes fully alive.

Peter and Paul—two very different men—each changed forever by a question and an encounter. Each became who they were meant to be because they listened... and responded. To believe in Christ is to step onto a road that opens us to a wider, deeper life. Faith, when it’s lived—not just inherited—has the power to illuminate our path. Some roads raise up life in us; others leave us depleted. But a faith that’s tested, chewed on, and digested grounds us in what is true and lasting.

As we celebrate this feast of Peter and Paul, may we have the courage to keep walking with Christ—especially when the way is unclear. May we lay down the weapons of hatred, canceling, apathy, and extremism—and instead lift up the tools of love, compassion, intentionality, and prudence. Let us take seriously the words of Jesus: “Love your enemies, do good, expecting nothing in return.”

Amen! Alleluia!
