Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

This Sunday's Gospel is one many of us know well—the Parable of the Good Samaritan. It remains a powerful and enduring lesson...on what true discipleship 'looks like' through the eyes of Jesus.

A man sincerely asks Jesus, "What must I do to inherit eternal life... to love God fully and follow Him with my whole heart?" Jesus affirms the heart of the Law: "Love God, love your neighbor, and love yourself." But the man pushes further, seeking to justify himself: "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus responds with a parable that would have shocked His audience. He describes 'not' a religious leader or insider as the true neighbor, but a Samaritan.

This would have been jarring—because Jews and Samaritans held deep-seated animosity and religious division. And yet—it is the Samaritan who sees the wounded man, is moved with compassion, and responds with concrete mercy: bandaging his wounds, providing shelter, and making sure he is cared for. Jesus is clear: the true neighbor is the one who shows mercy.

This parable continues to challenge anyone... who calls themselves Catholic, Christian, a lover of God—or even simply a person of goodwill. To follow Christ means stepping beyond comfort zones... to move through fear, prejudice, and unfamiliarity... And, to respond with compassion... when we encounter suffering. But how do we live this out today? Especially—in a world so marked by division, anger, violence, apathy, and fear of getting involved? We begin slowly, but steadily. First, we must learn how really... to *see*... to acknowledge the wounds and needs around us. Second, we must examine our fear... If our fear is rooted in control, paranoia, or self-protection... we will never move toward truth. Like the priest and the Levite, we risk 'missing' the heart of the Law... by trying too hard to preserve it. But when our fear is grounded in love... holy fear... inspired by God's Spirit... Then, it leads us outward! It moves us... to act not out of convenience, but conviction. Not for reward... but because it's good, right, and just. 'This' is when God's love... His Charity... becomes a guiding light—even in the darkest seasons of life. Only by embracing this holy fear—this sacred awe, and trust in God... can our steps forward... become part of *His* movement, and not just our own. As we approach the Eucharist today, may we receive not only the Body of Christ, but also His healing strength... And, the grace that frees us... from whatever holds us back... from being His real and active presence in the world.

May we be drawn beyond narrow ideas of discipleship, into the wide and merciful embrace of God... A Divine charity, whisper... who calls us to love without limits. "Love your enemies, do good, expecting nothing in return."

Amen! Alleluia! 🙏☀️
