istening must come before acting. For listening deeply informs how we act, and, in what spirit we act. Will I act with Charity or non-Charity? Contemplation allows the word to take root in us, and to live and act in, and through us. For - Action without contemplation is highly problematic. Contemplation allows us to sit in the present moment... of our lives... with all that challenges, and blesses us.. It allows us to find our breath again... and, to feel God present... deep within... our life and soul speaking... I am... I am here... just be still, and I know that I am God... I am... here. Contemplation is the path back to our humanity. Our full humanity. Contemplation is a path to sober spirituality, helping us avoid a shame-based and self-obsessed religiosity. Contemplation, lovingly afflicts our egos, and helps us realize... it's not our fault, it's not our fault... but it is our responsibility. In contemplation Christ calls us to "get up" shake off the dust of sin and separation... and walk to Christ and sit and listen at his feet.

"The one thing necessary" is to focus on this... and to allow our life to flow... wherever God, in Christ, leads us... both familiar or not... both comfort or not... God in Christ, and the Holy Spirit is present, and living and breathing in us! Jesus overturns social/religious/cultural convention... and let's nothing get in the way of serving the kingdom of God... for that is what our faith is for... that is where our rituals and practices should lead us. "The mass has ended... go in peace... to know, love, and serve the Lord and, one another.

Mary in the gospel... was simply taking up her position (of discipleship) in what was traditionally a man's world. It was common, in ancient times for women to be involved in the work of the kitchen and other details of hospitality — while the men set at the feet of the teacher, the rabbi, or the Pharisee... (listening, questioning, and growing in faith and life practice). For Mary to sit at the feet of the teacher, instead of being involved in the work of hospitality and service was confusing, and a personal assault to Martha, and to cultural women's roles at that time. Jesus points out... that Mary has chosen "the greater part" suggesting that everyone is summoned to discipleship... (above all) and to sit at Jesus's feet, to hear the message, take it in, and to carry this message to others... was most important than anything. Why? because God sees the heart of humanity (all people) and always responds with appropriate love... we are called to do the same.

We are not to allow any cultural hangups (which are meant not to rule humanity, but serve it) — to stop us from learning how to listen deeply... to God's call and summons — to the heart of the matter, and to the truth of life's situations — this is the on going work of discipleship — to hear Jesus, the Eternal Word of the Father speaking and being in fleshed in us, and lived out through the power and accompaniment of the Holy Spirit.

May this practice in deep listening... help us, to be free to respond lovingly, with both sensitivity and truth, to the complex needs of others, and our world... May we stop in chaotic moments... breathe deeply... and then take our proper place at the feet of Jesus, to listen and be nourished... so we may always choose the better part, and way... to proceed in life.

Amen! Alleluia! 🥠


